

A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:



The celebration of **Corpus Christi** was established in the mid-thirteenth century in response to diminished veneration of the Eucharist throughout the Church and the proliferation of Eucharistic heresies during the late Middle-Ages. The origin of the feast is found in two miracle stories. The first is that of St. Juliana of Cornillon. St. Juliana had a vision of the Church appearing as the full moon, but with a darkened spot appearing on its surface. She heard a gentle locution explaining that the darkened spot symbolized the fact that in all of the great celebrations of the Church year, a feast in honor of the Blessed Sacrament was missing. She sought spiritual direction from Bishop Robert deThorete, Bishop of Liege, who was moved to hold a synod and establish such a feast in his diocese starting in 1247. It is reported that she had also spoken with a Fr. Jacques Pantaleon, a priest of the diocese of Lyon, who would become Pope Urban IV (1261-1264).

The second miracle is that of Fr. Pietro de Praga, a German priest whose love of the Eucharist had grown cold due to doubts as to whether the Eucharist could really be the Body and Blood of Our Lord. In 1263 while celebrating Mass at Bolsena, at the breaking of the Bread, blood flowed from sacred host, covering the altar cloth, the corporal, and the floor. Pope Urban IV, in residence just miles away at Orvieto, commanded that the cloths be brought to him that he could witness what had happened. These relics remain at the Cathedral in Orvieto to this day.

Moved by this miracle and the testimony of St. Juliana, Pope Urban IV published a bull, titled *Transiturus de hoc mundo* ("As he was about to pass from this world"), which reflects on the institution of the Eucharist on Holy Thursday. It would become the first papally-sanctioned feast to be added to the universal calendar of the Church. There had been other theologians who had written of their doubts of the Eucharist, and their satisfaction with a 'merely symbolic' understanding of what it meant. This, of course, shies away from the perennial orthodoxy of Christ being truly present, Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity, under the appearances of bread and wine... what we understand as the "Real Presence" of the Eucharist. While, yes, the Eucharist is a symbol, but it does not simply point to a reality outside of itself. It is, by God's power and plan, the true perpetuation of Jesus' divine presence in the world for all time, until the consummation of the world. (As that one song says, we do NOT "look beyond the bread we eat"... it is in the very species which appears to our human senses as bread that we find the true divine presence of God!)

St. Thomas Aquinas (1225-1274), an eminent theologian of the day, was commissioned to write the Mass texts for the new feast—texts which appear in our Missals today. To go with those Mass texts, he wrote the words to a hymn, which speaks tenderly of the frail limitations of human perception, the grace of the incarnation to make us witnesses of Christ and his saving deeds, and the final triumph of faith when we are able to recognize our Lord "in the breaking of the bread".

*Sing, my tongue the Savior's Glory!
Of His Flesh, the mystery sing;
Of the Blood, all price exceeding,
Shed by our Immortal King,
Destined for the world's redemption,
From a noble Womb to spring.*

*Of a pure and spotless Virgin
Born for us on earth below,
He, as Man, with man conversing
Stayed, the seeds of truth to sow;
Then He closed in solemn order
Wondrously His life of woe.*

*On the night of that Last Supper,
Seated with his chosen band,
He, the Pascal Victim eating,
First fulfils the Law's command;
Then as Food to all his brethren
Gives Himself with his own Hand.*

*Word-made-Flesh, the bread of nature
By his Word to Flesh He turns;
Wine into His Blood he changes
What through sense no change discerns
Only be the heart in earnest,
Faith her lesson quickly learns.*

*Down in adoration falling,
Lo, the sacred Host we hail,
Lo, o'er ancient forms departing
Newer rites of grace prevail:
Faith for all defects supplying,
When the feeble senses fail.*

*To the everlasting Father
And the Son who comes on high
With the Holy Ghost proceeding
Forth from each eternally,
Be salvation, honor, blessing.
Might and endless majesty. Amen*

We will open our books for Mass intentions for 2026 on Tuesday, July 1. We presently have a back-log of Mass intention requests, and so we ask that those requesting multiple intentions only do so for the calendar year, with at least one daily Mass intention for every weekend Mass intention requested. We also request that on the high Holy Days of Christmas and Easter, that a family or intention only appear on that date once every third year, as to allow others the possibility of having those dates. (I also reserve one of the intentions myself for those dates to give to families who have suffered a very recent loss during these seasons.) Mass intentions are requests to apply the 'ministerial fruits' coming from the infinite goodness of the Mass in a special way. These graces fall upon the priest celebrating Mass, upon those he has promised to pray for, and then all of the faithful who are present at the Eucharistic Celebration.

Mass Intentions for 2026:

On Tuesday, July 1 we will 'open our books' for **Mass intentions in 2026**. These 'intentions' are for the deceased who are often mentioned during Mass, "for whom this Mass is offered". It is customary make an offering of \$10 for a Mass intention. While we do our best to accommodate date requests for specific intentions, we cannot guarantee or reserve particular dates. If there is a request for specific dates, we take them on a 'first-come first-served' basis. We do ask that when multiple intentions are being scheduled that they be divided somewhat evenly between weekend and weekday dates. Finally, we do ask that for major Holy Days (Christmas, Easter) that a particular intention or family only appear once every third year, in order to make these dates accessible to others who might want to choose that date. When we schedule an intention, it is with the understanding that our schedule can and does change on occasion, and when a date cannot be honored (because Mass is not being celebrated or it is being re-scheduled), we will do our best to accommodate other dates and choices... please be patient and cooperative with our parish staff when that need arises. Each Sunday and Holy Day a "Mass for the People", for all the living and deceased of the parish is celebrated, which calls to mind all of the faithful in the parish.
