## Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ

**JUNE 22, 2025** 

Genesis 14:18-20; 1 Corinthians 11:23-26; Luke 9:11b-17

Corpus Christi is more than a city in Texas. The words mean "Body of Christ." Today we celebrate the Mystery of the Holy Eucharist. It is the mystery by which Jesus Christ is truly present under appearances of bread and wine. It is the mystery by which Jesus Christ, under these forms, renews the offering of himself to our heavenly Father. The Mass is a renewal of the sacrifice of Christ on the cross, and of his entire saving life. The Eucharist is also the mystery by which the Lord Jesus Christ comes to us under appearances of bread and wine to be nourishment for our spiritual life.

Our first reading is the conclusion of a very strange story in Genesis. Abraham and his coalition had just defeated another coalition of tribes. Melchizedek is a pagan priest from Salem (or Jerusalem -- still a pagan city). Melchizedek blessed Abraham by his gods. Abraham replied that he owed his allegiance only to Yahweh, who was God almighty and Creator.

The story, however, is less important than the symbolism. Melzhizedek, in later Jewish tradition (Psalm 110) became a "type" or "symbol" of the eternal priesthood. Jewish priests had to be descended from Aaron; they were born and they died. But Melchizedek just "appears" and "disappears." Thus he symbolized priesthood without beginning or end. This is the priesthood of Jesus Christ, which is shown in the Eucharist.

The second reading is the oldest Biblical account of the institution of the Eucharist. It was written in 58 A.D., but Paul took it from the actually celebrated liturgy! The word "remembrance" (sometimes translated "memory") actually means memorial sacrifice. The word was used in the Old Testament for sacrifices which called upon God to remember his mercies. (It is not our remembering, but God's remembering!)

The most important memorial sacrifice of the Jews was Passover. The Eucharist is our Christian Passover by which God remembers to deliver us and to save us and to show us mercy. The word proclaim means to bring to the present and make effective and actual. As often as we celebrate the Eucharist, we bring to the present and make effective the salvation of Christ. Covenant means that we have a bargain to keep. Our part of the bargain is to do all that Christ wants of us, to live as he wants us to live.

The Gospel helps us to accept this Mystery. If Jesus could multiply loaves and fishes to feed 5,000 people, then he has the power to change bread and wine into his Body and Blood. He also has the power to be present under these forms in every Mass throughout the world.

Let us renew our appreciation of the Mystery of the Holy Eucharist.

The Most Holy Body & Blood of Christ Solemnity, June 22, 2025 Dear Parishioners,

Even though we have entered into what is called "Ordinary Time" in our Church calendar, we still celebrate certain solemnities on the three weekends after Pentecost. Last weekend, we celebrated the Solemnity of the Holy Trinity. This weekend we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, or what is traditionally called Corpus Christi. Then next weekend, the Church will celebrate the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul. After all of these celebrations, the Church will return to "Ordinary time" on the Fourth of July weekend. This little bit of background will help us understand and appreciated the Church's liturgical calendar.


Perhaps one of the most beautiful prayers for this Solemnity is found in our Opening Prayer for this Solemnity. It states: "O God, who in this wonderful Sacrament have left us a memorial of your Passion, grant us, we pray, so to revere the sacred mysteries of your Body and Blood that we may always experience in ourselves the fruits of your redemption. Who live and reign with God the Father in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen." This prayer summarizes what our Eucharist is always about, namely, the memorial of Jesus' Passion. And as we celebrate this Eucharist, it helps us "revere" the sacred mysteries of Jesus' Body and Blood that we may experience in ourselves the very fruits of our redemption. As I said, this prayer summarizes for all of us the importance of the Eucharist so that as we celebrate it, we may realize the fruits of what Jesus has gained for us in His suffering, death, and resurrection. And may these fruits be recognized, appreciated, and celebrated each and every time that we celebrate the Eucharist, the source and summit of our life of faith.

When we take that opening prayer and begin to live it, we have made present St. Paul's beautiful description of the Eucharist. Paul tells us in his letter to the Corinthians that "I received from the Lord what I also handed on to you, that the Lord Jesus, on the night He was handed over, took bread, and, after He had given thanks, broke it and said, 'This is my body that is for you. Do this in remembrance of me.' In the same way, also the cup, after supper, saying, 'This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.' For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the death of the Lord until He comes.'" Let this short description of St. Paul fill our minds and thoughts of what the Eucharist is celebrating. And may each of us, as we celebrate and live these words, appreciate always this great Sacrament of His love and Presence.

The past several weekends, we have been highlighting members of our parish who have graduated from various colleges. We are extremely proud of the accomplishments of our graduates and congratulate them on a job well done. God has blessed you with some great talents—please use them to give Him greater honor and glory.

Please remember in your prayers our men's Cursillo weekend to be held next weekend, June 19-22. Our prayers are with you as we ask the Holy Spirit to guide and direct your lives close to Him and His Church.

As we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, we want to remember the fruits of each Mass we celebrate. According to Christian tradition and a human understanding of what God does in His wisdom and love, the spiritual benefits of the Mass are three-fold:

- 1. The universal Church is graced.
- 2. The person/intention for whom the Mass is offered is graced.
- 3. The priest who offers it is graced.

And the Fruits of Holy Communion are the following:

- 1. Causes an intimate union with Christ.
- 2. Preserves, increases, and renews the life of grace received at Baptism.
- 3. Cleanses past sins and preserves from future sins.
- 4. Strengthens the unity among members of the Church
- 5. Fosters a commitment to those who are poor.






