

A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:




The calendar of 2025 presents an interesting assortment of Sunday feasts, interrupting the ordinary time readings. These feasts have not been celebrated on Sundays since 2014 because of how the calendar is arranged. Today, June 29 extends the celebration of the post-Easter solemnities of Trinity Sunday and Corpus Christi by one more week as we observe the Feast in honor of Sts. Peter and Paul. Later on this summer, we will celebrate the Triumph of the Cross on Sunday, September 14, and then on Saturday, November 1 and Sunday November 2, we

will celebrate All Saints and All Soul's Day. Finally, Sunday, November 9 is the Feast of the Dedication of St. John Lateran which presents to us a meditation on the Church, built of 'living stones' (cf. Pt 2:5) as we celebrate the Cathedral Church of Rome.

in the early Church. Simon would become Peter as a follower of Christ during his earthly ministry; Saul would become Paul as he was claimed by Christ to preach to the Gentiles. Both would die in Rome in witness to the faith, and both are revered by the Church, showing forth the power of Christ working in their lives and ministries.

While these two apostles are part of a larger constellation of characters who followed Jesus, one of the most important observations of this dualfeast is to realize that, as a Church, we need these different charisms. Without



this 'apostolic duality', something would be missing from the Church's ministerial outreach. Without Peter standing before the assembled faithful, we do not have that authoritative leadership that speaks at the Council of Jerusalem (cf. Acts 15) calling upon the Holy Spirit to help the Church discern the truth on faith and morals. Without Peter, we do not have the personal eye-witness account of the resurrection. Without Peter's definitive proclamation at Caesarea Philippi, "You are the Christ, the Son of the Living God!" (Mt 16) we lack the fundamental insight of what the life and ministry of Jesus was all about. Paul, on the other hand, would be the one to remind the Church that great sinners can become great saints through the unmerited grace of God. Paul would be the one to reach out to the margins and proclaim the faith to the ends of the earth. Paul would be the one demonstrating that faith can come to those who hear the proclamation, even all these years later, just as assuredly as those who stood at the

Without Peter as an archetype of leadership and discernment, the Church would be fractured without the unifying voice of our pope and bishops to lead the Church in the grace of the Spirit. Without Paul, the Church would be limited in its missionary vision, perhaps preferring to stay home or simply remaining a movement within Jewish society to the exclusion of the larger world. When we consider the roles of John (the one who loved Jesus), James (who ministered in Jerusalem), Mary, the Mother of God, and of the other women, we get an idea that each had an important role to play. In the same way, the many gifts in the Church today are valued in their diversity... not only to help us understand who Jesus was from many converging viewpoints, but to help us to accomplish ministry to a Church with a worldwide vision and worldwide reach.



Friday, July 4 is the observance of Independence Day, the 249th since the birth of our nation. Mass will be at 9:00 a.m., as we have been doing on Fridays this summer until school resumes in August.





Mass Intentions for 2026: On Tuesday, July 1 we will 'open our books' for Mass intentions in 2026. These 'intentions' are for the

deceased who are often mentioned during at Mass, "for whom this Mass is offered". It is customary to make an offering of \$10 for a Mass intention. While we do our best to accommodate date requests for specific intentions, we cannot guarantee or reserve particular dates. If there is a request for specific dates. we take them on a 'first-come first-served' basis. We do ask that when multiple intentions are being scheduled that they be divided somewhat evenly between weekend and weekday dates. Finally, we do ask that for major Holy Days (Christmas, Easter) that a particular intention or family only appear once every third year, in order to make these dates accessible to others who might want to choose that date.
