Pastor's Letter

June 29, 2025—Saints Peter & Paul Apostles

Dear Church Family,

As you all know the church has just gone through a very exciting time. The cardinals of the church gathered in conclave and elected a new pope. This was an intense time in the life of the church and all of us were lifting up the leaders of the church in prayer that the Holy Spirit would guide them. As Pope Leo begins his pontificate we need to continue to pray for him for God's guidance, strength, and protection.

In our first reading for today from the Acts of the Apostles we are reminded that the prayer of the church has always sustained her leaders. We read that St. Peter has been put in prison by King Herod, but, it says, "Prayer by the church was fervently being made to God on his behalf." God heard their prayer and Peter was miraculously set free from the clutches of his persecutors.

It is so important for all of us to pray constantly for the Pope, our bishops, and all leaders in the church. The ministry of each can only be carried out with the support of all. No one can bear the burden of this responsibility alone, but God, in answer to the prayers of his people, does not leave us alone. As St. Paul says in our second reading, "The Lord stood by me and gave me strength, so that through me the proclamation might be completed and all the Gentiles might hear it. And I was rescued from the lion's mouth. The Lord will rescue me from every evil threat and will bring me safe to his heavenly Kingdom. To him be glory forever and ever. Amen." Those of us who serve the people of God know that we can count on him to make up for our weakness. We also know that we can count on you, our brothers and sisters, to help us with your prayers so that together we might grow in closeness to God and to each other and complete the mission of making God's love known in the world.


Peter & Paul

Today we are celebrating the feasts of Saints Peter and Paul. They are such important saints that their feast day takes the place of the usual Sunday. Saint Peter was the chief of the Apostles.
