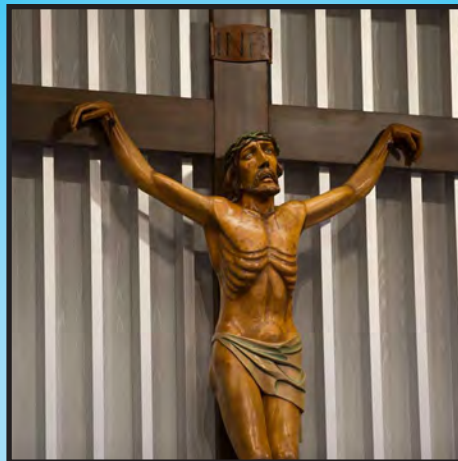

June 8, 2025 - Pentecost Sunday - C

A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:



The Easter Celebration comes to its climax today as we observe the Solemnity of Pentecost... the fiftieth day after Easter, when the Holy Spirit was released among the disciples in a new and powerful way.

The descent of the Holy Spirit is not a 'consolation prize' after Jesus ascended into heaven. As much as it would seem that order and faithfulness of the Church's teaching would be preserved by Jesus simply staying in this world and communicating his teachings about nuclear war, sexual ethics, liturgical requirements, the preferential option for the poor, who should be priests and bishops

and popes, and all sorts of other decisions. Having to get on an airplane in order to speak to Jesus in person is not how Jesus established his Church. He chose to go to heaven, and then he sent the gift of the Holy Spirit, the Third Person of the Holy Trinity—nothing less than the very presence of God—to help us to remember his teachings and guide us in all wisdom.

When a person is baptized, we say that the debt of original sin is removed from the soul of that person. In place of this fundamental alienation from God, the Holy Spirit enters, and the person is said to be in a state of "sanctifying grace". As long as the person does not commit 'mortal sin', that is, participating in a seriously-evil act, knowingly, and with full consent of will, the person retains that indwelling of the Holy Spirit, guiding the Christian in virtue and perseverance in the faith. Sanctifying Grace is the grace of God's life within us, which is strengthened by the other sacraments, most notably the Eucharist, which is the Real Presence of the Second Person of the Trinity.

Among the faithful, the Holy Spirit continues to guide the Church in all things. We recently had an example of that in the papal conclave, which is modeled after the deliberations which appointed Matthias as apostle after Judas, who had fallen away. This reading is found in the first chapter of the Acts of the Apostles immediately after Jesus went to heaven. Did Jesus put a name in an envelope for the disciples to discover his wishes? Did Jesus say that the reconstitution of the Apostolic Twelve was his first priority for the Church? No. But, by the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, the disciples assembled and prayed for insight and revelation of the will of God. Two disciples were put forward as candidates. Matthias "won" the selection process and Rufus "lost", but if we regard that the Holy Spirit were truly in charge all along, both candidates would be understood to be exactly where they needed to be to fulfill the will of God and the needs of the Church. In the same way, the sincere discernment of the Cardinals may have had multiple answers to 'who is the man best prepared to lead the Church', and their votes may have had some diversity of opinion, but the Holy Spirit helped the cardinals find consensus and elect a new pope.

In a similar way, we find the Council of Jerusalem in the pages of the Acts of the Apostles, where the disciples gathered and discussed the need for clarity on whether the Greek Christians needed to follow Jewish Law, namely the rite of circumcision. After deliberation and the expression of multiple opinions, Peter stood up and resolved the question using what we might identify as the unique Petrine charism which would belong to popes for generations to come. The Holy Spirit continues to protect our leaders, not through a slavish obedience, but through the invitation to discernment of the will and intentions of God, as expressed by the Holy Spirit. It is this Spirit that remains strong in the life of the Church unto our day, and which is the reason and meaning of our celebration of Pentecost today!

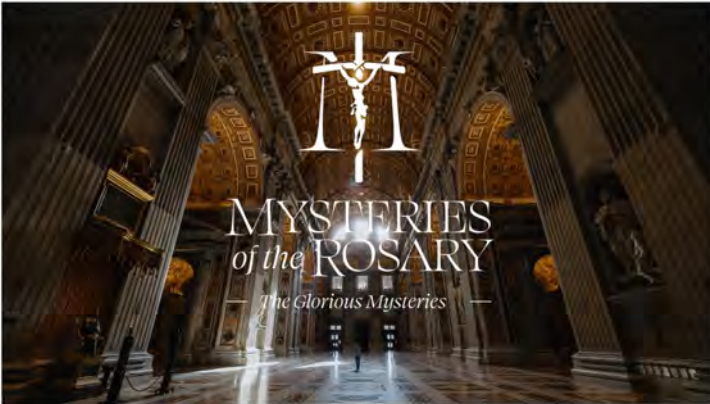
