## Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

**JULY 13, 2025** 

Deuteronomy 30:10-14; Colossians 1:15-20; Luke 10:25-37

Our faith is eminently simple. Love God, and love neighbor. We do not need to be geniuses or doctors of theology to do this. We don't need to go to a faraway country to find some esoteric guru to explain to us the mysteries of life. We simply need to love God with all our heart, soul, strength, and mind, and to love our neighbor as ourselves. In the first reading, Moses tells us that if we really did this, all the nations of the world would see how truly wise we are.

In the Gospel, Jesus combines two commandments of the Torah as the summary of all morality and virtue: Deuteronomy 6:5 tells us to love God with heart, soul, strength, and mind. Leviticus 19:18 tells us to love our neighbor as ourselves.

Sometimes, however, we like to put limits on love, so Jesus told the parable of the Good Samaritan. Jews and Samaritans hated each other; yet here a Samaritan looks after a bloodied Jew when his fellow Jews looked away. That kind of love is to be the measure of our own: Providing for those in need, even if they are enemies.

Having said that faith is eminently simple, our second reading is one of the most profound passages in the entire Bible! The background is the belief of the Jews that the Torah was the eternal, unchanging, self-manifestation of God.

From all eternity, God spoke his word in the Torah. The Torah was the model of all creation, and well as the cause and purpose of all creation. All things were made for the Torah and unto the Torah. The Torah was delivered to Moses in time, on Mt. Sinai, but it was eternal.

Paul had been a Pharisee. When he became Christian, he simply applied to Jesus Christ everything that he had previously believed about the Torah: Jesus Christ is the image of the invisible God. He (not the Torah) is the first born of creation. All things were created in him and for him (and not in and for the Torah.)

Everything that makes God to be God resides bodily in Jesus Christ. He is the "fullness" of the Father. Faith is simple enough for the humblest of persons; yet it is pro-found enough to boggle the mind of the reatest scholar!

# The Parish of St. Peter Quincy, IL

Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time, July 13, 2025

#### Dear Parishioners,

As a teacher of the faith, there is one question that is often asked as people want a definitive answer. That question is basically, "how do I get to heaven?" When people consider their mortality, this question becomes front and center in the lives of many. Well, it was no different in Jesus' time. In our gospel today Jesus is approached by a scholar of the law and is asked the simple question, "Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" As I stated, people want to know the answer to this simple question. It will continue to plague each of us as we imagine our lives ending here on earth. The question is, "what's next?" And "how do I attain the what's next?" In reply, Jesus asks, "how do you read the law?" The scholar responded, "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your being, with all your strength, and with all your mind, and your neighbor as yourself." One can imagine Jesus's response, nodding and thinking, "this young man gets it." But this is where the exchange gets interesting as this scholar asks, "who is my neighbor?" Rather than stating who the neighbor is, Jesus gives a parable of the Good Samaritan, a concrete story stating matter of fact how we are to act as a neighbor. The unexpected happens as the neighbor becomes a person unexpected, perhaps someone with whom we have issues. But the one person that does respond is the one person a Jewish person would never have expected to be the neighbor - namely, a Samaritan. I'm sure this story raised some eyebrows and created a stir in many. It's as if Jesus takes a person in our lives, an enemy who has hurt us, or a relative who created havoc in our lives, and raises them up as the neighbor in our lives. And all Jesus does as He concluded His story is to tell us "go and do likewise." Treat others as this Samaritan treated this victim of robbers.

On the weekend of July 19-20, we will be having a visiting priest who will be present as part of the annual Missionary Appeal sponsored by the diocese. This appeal provides differing parishes with priests from all over the missionary world, touching on our hearts of generosity to assist them in their various ministries. This year we will be having Fr. Varghese Aratukulam from the diocese of Alleppey, India who will be with us next weekend asking us to assist them in their many needs. I ask that you welcome him as we normally do and respond generously to his appeal. Remember, we are the Samaritan as we assist the victims who need our help.

As you can see from observation, our construction project continues. The pilings in the ground will be completed and I can picture some of the foundation to begin taking shape. It's exciting to observe and I can't wait to see its completion which should be next July. What an addition this will be to our school and parish. I am so proud of this family and what we have done together. Thank you for being the stewardship parish that you are. Besides sharing your generosity of time, talents, and treasures with us, we also have been sharing our treasures with our sister parishes in Haiti. Recently I sent a check of Fr. Michel for \$27,615 which included the \$15,000 quarterly commitment along with \$12,615 for the tuition payments made by some of our parishioners.



#### Fr. Leo's column continued..

I found the following that I would like to share with you. I was personally moved by it and thought you might be the same. It's called "Dancing with God."

"When I meditated on the word Guidance, I kept seeing 'dance' at the end of the word. I remember reading that doing God's will is a lot like dancing. When two people try to lead, nothing feels right. The movement doesn't flow with the music, and everything is quite uncomfortable and jerky. When one person realizes that, and lets the other lead, both bodies begin to flow with the music. One gives gentle cues, perhaps with a nudge to the back or by pressing lightly in one direction or another. It's as if two become one body, moving beautifully. The dance takes surrender, willingness and attentiveness from one person and gentle guidance and skill from the other. My eves drew back to the word 'Guidance.' When I saw 'G' I thought of God, followed by 'u' and 'i'. 'God,' 'u' and 'i dance.' God, you and I dance. As I lowered my head, I became willing to trust that I would get guidance about my life. Once again, I became willing to let God lead."




