## *Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time*

**JULY 20, 2025**

Genesis 18:1-10a;

Colossians 1:24-28;

Luke 10:38-42

In the nomadic culture of the ancient Middle East, *hospitality* was the principal virtue. Even an enemy had to be treated as a brother as long as he was under your tent. In the first reading, Abraham shows this kind of hospitality to three “strangers.” He was rewarded by the promise that his free wife, Sarah, would have a son.

But, as important as hospitality was, Jesus says that there is something even more important: Listening to and reflecting on his word are more important than the details of hospitality.

Someone must do the cooking and cleaning up. We must never permit others to work while we play. But when a friend visits, we should pay attention to the friend, and not to minute details of hospitality. How much more should we pay attention to our friend, Jesus, who is always with us? Martha is the ideal church worker; Mary is the ideal disciple.

The second reading teaches the value of our crosses when offered in union with Christ. We are one with him in the Mystical Body, the Church. Our words, works, and prayers, take on a new and infinite dimension when offered through and with Christ.

We participate in the very redemptive act of his cross. In this reading, Paul also marvels at the great “mystery” of God’s mercy. Jews hated non-Jews (Gentiles), and non-Jews (Gentiles) hated Jews. The “mystery” is that God has brought the two together in Jesus Christ.

## 16TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

### On the Gift of Priesthood

The readings for this Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time present for our reflection the theme of hospitality. Where hospitality is well shown, the beneficiary is very happy, feels loved and experiences the sense of tranquility. In the first reading from Genesis, Abraham and his family showed a classical example of hospitality to three men on a journey. In the gospel passage, Mary and Martha showed hospitality to Jesus according to their individual natures. Martha was more concerned about material hospitality – what to eat, what to drink, a befitting place to host Him, etc. Mary on the other hand was more concerned about spiritual hospitality – listening to the innermost concerns of Jesus.

I write simply to appreciate your hospitality and love since I came into this wonderful and beautiful parish last September to minister to you. One of the earliest things that caught my attention is the politeness of the people of Quincy. You received me with enthusiasm and ever since, it has been all joy flowing along with you. Your hospitality as people and individuals has kept my ministry smooth and juicy.

Last Monday, July 14, marked the 13<sup>th</sup> anniversary of my priestly ordination. The way you greeted the news and the continuous outpouring of congratulations and prayers were quite exhilarating. I write to thank you all.

Priesthood is a gift. The job of the receiver is to be appreciative to God, the giver of the gift, by total dedication of oneself to God's service. It is not easy, but the beautiful news is that the same giver of the gift gives enabling graces for the best use of the gift. God is ever ready to give that gift for the good of His Church but He needs those who will accept it with their whole heart. Having taken hold of this gift for 13 good years, I testify that it is one of the best things that can happen to a soul. To be a priest is wonderful. I invite men and boys to open up for the possibility of receiving this wonderful gift. A "yes" wholeheartedly said is the fundamental step to receiving it. Encourage your sons and grandsons, relatives and friends, if it is the will of God.

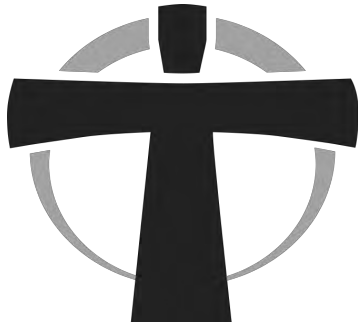
