

Wells Street Repair and Expansion Coming Soon. The first round of the major project on Wells Street involves the following dates: Tuesday, July 22, valve replacement at the corner of Wells and Young Streets; and beginning Tuesday, July 29, extension of a small part of our SPPS parking lot into the storm drain. The work on Wells Street running by the school is set for completion by August 8. The work on Wells Street running by the SPPN Church and St. Joseph House will begin after Labor Day weekend, and extend into the middle of October. It's during this period of time that our Masses will be taking place at the Knights of Columbus Alleman Council Hall in downtown Nauvoo. We'll keep you posted on any further updates!

Fr. Tony Now on Diocesan Committees. Fr. Tony will serve for the next year on the Catholic Charities Advisory Board, and will also be on the Growing Disciples Committee in Peoria for further discussion on how the diocese can better respond to area needs here, and throughout the diocese. This means quarterly meetings - which isn't all that much, but it will take me away from our area since these meetings take place in Peoria.

Deacon Dan Moffitt on Senior Status. Don't panic! He's still going to be active as ever in his service to us as a deacon. This is a technical designation to indicate that, should he want to, he can step back from as little or as much as he wants. But he's not that kind of guy - lucky for us! Congratulations, Deacon Dan, for this recognition of achievement and status among the ordained clergy of the Diocese of Peoria!

A Possible Visit to my Brother. There's a good chance that I might have to be gone on Thursday, July 31 and Friday, August 1, to visit my brother in Ft. Thomas, Kentucky. If I am away, there won't be a Mass on Friday Morning, August 1; instead, there will be a Liturgy of the Word with the Distribution of Holy Communion Outside of Mass, led by one of our deacons. (Please remember the difference between this way of receiving Communion, and a Mass. In the Gospels, Jesus multiplied loaves and fishes twice, and in both events, fragments left over from the actual miracles were gathered into baskets. OK. When you're at Mass, you're at the actual multiplication of the loaves and fishes - meaning, you're participating in, as well as partaking of, the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of Jesus Christ. A Liturgy of Holy Communion without Mass is receiving the fragments - meaning, you're receiving the miracle of Communion already consecrated, without being present and participating in the miracle of the Mass itself. You should prefer the Mass. Should it ever get to the point that time and convenience would make you want the Communion without the Mass, more than the Mass itself, that's when this feature ends. We're members of the Catholic Church: we should want the Mass.)

SMH Church Drawing Meeting. After our information and open discussion meeting this past Sunday, it's time for St. Mary Church, now designated no longer in use, to conduct its Church Drawing Event. That's going to be on Sunday, August 10, beginning at 1 p.m. St. Mary parishioners, still officially registered, will have first access to the drawing - hopefully. (Procedures for these kinds of events are never perfect, and the unpredictable has been known to occur.) Parishioners who have themselves donated - or whose families from the past have donated - items that they would like to have returned to them should contact Fr. Tony by the previous Sunday, August 3. Our thanks to SMH Trustees, Jim Layfield and Sandy Printy, for their preparation in bringing about our last meeting - not to mention the work involved in preparation for August 10!
