From the Pastor's Desk

Today the Church celebrates the Seventeenth Sunday of Ordinary Time which places us at the half-way point of Ordinary Time. Each Liturgical Year we celebrate thirty-three or thirty-four weeks of Ordinary Time.

The First Reading from Genesis for today reminds us that in the beginning with God, Abraham demonstrates a real persistence in prayer and then in the Gospel, Jesus invites us to persist in prayer as well, to ask, seek, knock. May our prayer open us to God's Will and so build up His strength within us for as St. Paul tells us in the Second Reading, in Baptism, we have died with Christ and have been raised to life with Him.

And so, we are confident in the Lord's instruction, "Ask and you will receive." All of Sacred Scripture tells of the necessity of prayer and Jesus exhorts us to be persistent because something powerful happens in that repetition. As we ask, as we return to the source of mercy and love, we are

changed by our encounter with God. Indeed, God is faithful, God is merciful!

-LITURGICAL CELEBRATIONS THIS WEEK – Tuesday, July 29, Obligatory Memorial of Saints Martha, Mary, and Lazarus. In the household of Bethany, Jesus experienced the family spirit and friendship of Martha, Mary, and Lazarus. Let us pray for families and for the good and holy friendships God has given to us.

Wednesday, July 30 – Optional memorial of St. Peter Chrysologus, Bishop and Doctor of the Church, known for his exceptional preaching ability.

Thursday, July 31 – Obligatory Memorial of St. Ignatius of Loyola, Priest and founder of the Society of Jesus (Jesuits).

Friday, August 1 – Obligatory Memorial of St. Alphonsus Liguori, Bishop and Doctor of the Church and founder of the Redemptorists; stressed Christ's love and Mary's intercession; master of moral theology; patron of confessors and moral theologians.

Saturday, August 2 – Optional memorials of St. Eusebius of Vercelli, Bishop; St. Peter Julian Eymard, Priest.

-DAY OF PRAYER – Today, Sunday, July 27, is designated the World Day of Prayer for Grandparents and the Elderly. We pray in a special way for the elderly and especially our Grandparents, living and deceased, who have passed the faith on to us. This day of prayer is especially important with today's lack of respect for life in general, especially the unborn and the aged.
