

Our Next Steps for Our Newly Aligned Parish. In the coming weeks, we will be entertaining and negotiating the sale of SHDC and SMH properties; developing a unified budget in terms of cash flow to meet financial responsibilities, while keeping separate records of our church sites as the diocese further develops our unified financial structure; gradual transfer of funds from local financial institutions to the Diocesan Loan Fund and the Elizabeth Seton Fund; and seeing to the possessions of SHDC and SMH Churches.

About the Diocesan Loan Fund and the Elizabeth Seton Fund: the money is still and forever ours. And we can designate its purpose and keep separate the sources of the deposited funds.

About items from our closed churches available for our people: currently working on itemization.

SHDC Church Item Drawing. This is really for all our parishioners throughout the county; but especially so, for parishioners of our recently discontinued Sacred Heart Church in Dallas City. What you are now reading is the current operating procedure for the Drawing of Church items at Sacred Heart Church, Dallas City, no matter what you've heard before. Because of the prominence and unique identification of family dedicated Church windows, we have decided to give special consideration for families wanting such windows for reasons of attachment to the indicated family dedication. This is only a consideration for family church windows. Everything else up for the drawing goes the way as described at our previous meetings. The date of the drawing is Sunday, July 13, at Noon, at Sacred Heart Church, Dallas City. We need to know of your interest by Wednesday, July 9, by contact as well as by presentation of your ticket. Because of the final determination of the cost of window removal by Jacksonville Stained Glass, we ask \$500, if we take the window out of the drawing, to help with the removal of the window. If you contact the rectory by July 9, and leave your name, contact number, and your interest in a particular window, the rectory will forward your contact to one of our trustees, Dave Johnson or Ruth Higgins, for more direct and thorough contact. Keep in mind that some have already expressed family interest and their reasons, first; good faith requires that initial indications be honored. So - whether you've already approached us, or are considering it for the first time - either way, please contact the rectory. We'll get you in touch with our trustees.
