

#### July 6, 2025 - Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time-C

#### A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:

Paul wrote the Church in the Roman province of Galatia in about 50-60 AD, concerning himself mainly with downplaying the differences and disagreements between Jewish and Greek Christians. The reading we hear at today Mass is the conclusion of the letter, where he says that he should "never boast except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ". Being Jew or Gentile makes no difference to him, but rather that one is truly a "new creation" in Christ. (Gal 6:17-18)

There is a fitting parallel with the last paragraph of the long form of today's Gospel. In the Gospel, Jesus sent out the seventy-two to preach the coming of the Lord. When they returned, they spoke highly of the power that flowed from their hands... and Jesus confirmed that they had the power to charm snakes, battle spirits, and endure scorpions... but that they were not to rejoice because of these spirits being



subject to them, but that they were to rejoice because their names were written in heaven! (Luke 10:19-20)

Both readings are trying to reveal the deepest truth of our Christian lives and ministries and apostolates. We will witness great things and make tremendous sacrifices. We will affiliate and identify ourselves with certain practices of religion. The key difference in being Christian however, is that we bear the likeness of the death and resurrection in our bodies. That in doing so, our names are written in heaven itself! This is not to say that the external observances of our faith are unimportant, but rather that they must lead to a true conversion of heart and a growing trust of God's power working through us. "Success" while on mission is not the primary measure of God's power, but "faithfulness" and "trust" in his will. Some disciples seemed "unsuccessful" and shook the dust from their feet as they left their towns. Paul himself recognized the defeat in the cross through the many stumbles and humiliations along his path. But in all of these trials, the promise of a place in God's Kingdom motivates each to continue on his or her path, offering whatever fruits result to the glory of God's providence.

We are two weeks out from our annual St. Anthony Picnic on the grounds of St. Anthony Church. The evening will begin with Mass at 4:00 p.m. Food, drink,



games, and other activities will continue through the evening until midnight. There will be no 6:30 p.m. Mass on Saturday, rather the 4:00 p.m. Mass will be held on Sunday night as a concession to those who work so diligently to make the celebration possible. Chair people will be looking for last-minute volunteers to help staff stands and activities in the coming weeks. Please say "yes" when they call. If you are willing to help out and haven't heard from them yet, please call the parish office and we'll make sure you get set up with a way to chip in!

Looking ahead... on the weekend of **August 2-3**, we will offer the Anointing of the Sick at all of our Sunday Masses. We welcome those who have family members who are sick or infirm to make special arrangements to allow these family members to be with us as we celebrate that sacrament publicly.

A reminder: Daily Mass is celebrated at 6:00 p.m. on Wednesday nights and at 9:00 a.m. on Friday mornings during the summer season until school resumes in August.
