Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

JULY 6, 2025

Isaiah 66:10-14c; Galatians 6:14-18; Luke 10:1-12.17-20

A theme of joy pervades the texts of today's Mass. The joy comes from the proclamation of Good News. What is the "Good News?" In its essence, it is that God loves us, that he will see us through any crisis, and that he promises us everlasting joy.

The first reading is from the very last chapter of Isaiah. Isaiah sees the joy and peace which will come with God's Messiah. All nations will be united: all will worship together; all will be prosperous; there will be peace. God will triumph.

Isaiah expected that this would happen shortly after the return of the exiles from Babylon; it didn't happen that way. But still we must have hope. The Responsorial Psalm echoes the reading: Let all the earth cry out to God with joy. Proclaim the marvelous deeds of the Lord; think of the blessings he has given you.

The Gospel is the story of Jesus' sending out seventy-two disciples to be his heralds on his way to Jerusalem. They are to proclaim that the reign of God is at hand. When the disciples return, Jesus rejoices even though he is on his way to Jerusalem to suffer and die. He rejoices because he sees Satan fall from heaven. He rejoices because the power of evil will be broken. He rejoices because eternal joy awaits in heaven.

The second reading tells us that we must never boast except in the cross of Christ. This seems strange. We want joy and happiness, yet we are to glory only in the cross! But it is only by our willingness to empty ourselves in sharing the cross of Christ that we shall conquer evil and find

Why are we sad? We are we depressed? If we realize that God loves us, that he will always win, and that he will give us eternal life, how can we remain sad? Let us rejoice in God's Good News. Let us live in peace.

Dear Parishioners,

On this Fourth of July weekend, we gather to give God thanks for the country in which we live and the freedoms for which we enjoy. As we gather on this Independence Day on Friday, and celebrate the richness of our country, our thoughts turn toward a spirit of gratitude for all that God has blessed us and we pray today that this same spirit of gratitude will permeate our lives and assist us in our care and concern for each other. May God continue to bless us and this country in which we live. May we use our freedoms enjoyed to assist others in their pursuit of happiness and joy.

This weekend the Church finally returns to what is termed as "ordinary time." In fact, this weekend is the 14th Sunday in this Ordinary Time. We find in our gospel, Jesus appointing 72 disciples to be sent out in pairs to everyone and places Jesus intended to visit. It's interesting that they are sent in pairs as it indicates to me that our vocation as a disciple is not of being alone but rather we are to work with others in bringing about His kingdom. This is the whole idea of our Church being a community of believers, joined with each other to spread the gospel and to strengthen each other. Then Jesus tells these disciples that they have an important calling, namely, to be the laborers in carrying out Jesus' will. In fact, Jesus even forewarns them that they will be like lambs among wolves, that their message will not be heard and will be negated by the deafness of people. But the other interesting fact of this calling, is that Jesus tells the disciples that they are "to carry no money bag, no sack, no sandals," but whatever town they enter they are to announce that the "kingdom of God is at hand." In other words, these disciples are to trust on God and God alone. I don't know about you but I'm not sure I would feel comfortable with this challenge of Jesus. To depend upon only God and God alone, takes the control out of my hands and places this control in the hands of God. That takes a trust that sometimes I find myself deficient. But that's the challenge of our gospel today. And what happens is that the "72 returned rejoicing, and said, Lord even the demons are subject to us because of your name." This is what trust does when we entrust our lives and hearts to the God who sends us forth to proclaim His kingdom.

Next Wednesday, July 9, we will be having our annual procession and prayer at the grave of Fr. Augustus Tolton. The procession will form at St. Peter Church at 5:30 p.m. and will proceed down Maine Street to celebrate Evening Prayer and Benediction at 6:30 p.m. in St. Peter Cemetery. Those unable to partake in the procession may gather at the grave. Please, no parking in the cemetery due to lack of space. Some chairs and water will be provided.

We are still looking for Eucharistic ministers to take Holy Communion to the homebound on weekends either on a monthly basis or as a substitute. This is a very rewarding and enriching ministry and helps you to see a different side of the parish family. If interested, please call the rectory or email us and we will assist you in beginning this ministry.

Our patron saint of the USA: Mary the Immaculate Conception, pray for us and for our country.






