


What we're watching on Formed: What Catholics Believe: Join professors of the Augustine Institute and other Catholic experts as they answer the most popular questions from the Internet on topics like the Eucharist, the Resurrection, the Papacy, Relics, and so much more! Was Jesus a ghost when he appeared to the Apostles? Is the Resurrection important? Are Catholics cannibals? Is the Eucharist in the Bible? Find out in this exciting series!

Perpetual Novena Continues. Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, in silent prayer and spiritual reading of whatever you bring for your time there: five more Wednesday evenings, at ICC Church site, from 6:30 to 7:30 p.m. Our main purpose is solidarity in prayer with our Spanish speaking parishioners who are concerned about problems arising from waiting for visa and permit renewals when applications have been already sent in. But there's something else going on, and in the smallest of delicate steps: two cultures trying to open themselves to each other. We begin and end the Adoration period with the Anima Christi and Divine Praises prayed in English and in Spanish. And, depending on your "mother tongue," by trying to recite these prayers in another language means a lot, in both directions. We're not trying to change United States' culture; we're not trying to keep Latino culture isolated and separate. No takeovers or makeovers here. We're only moving toward mutual acceptance, with a sharing of customs allowing people to accept and get to know each other. Again: not a huge thing, by any means. But an important step along the way, for all of us.

Hearing Loop System Coming to ICC Church Site. Essentially, a hearing loop system transmits an electro-magnetic signal that can easily be picked up by a user's hearing aid. About 70 to 80% of hearing aids have the t-coil component necessary to bring the audio sound directly to their custom prescribed hearing aids. For those that may not yet wear hearing aids and struggle to hear well in church, or have hearing aids that do not have the t-coil, loop receivers are available to get a clear sound to people's ears as well, which reduces any room background noise or reverberation. There will be a Hearing Loop System set up and demonstration on Thursday, August 14, at 10.30 a.m. All who have hearing aids with a t-coil, or would like to try a loop receiver, are welcome to attend, and be a part of the demonstration!

The Solemnity of the Assumption, August 14/15. Preserved from Original Sin, with the grace of being able to exercise her human freedom perfectly because that's what freedom from sin does, Mary, the mother of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, experiences her Assumption, body and soul, into heaven. The Assumption of our Mother in the order of grace is an expression of veneration, love, and joy. It's also an anticipation of our own presence in heaven, body and soul, when Our Lord comes again. 


