From the Pastor's Desk

Today the Church celebrates the Nineteenth Sunday of Ordinary Time. Our readings for today remind us of the seemingly simple truth that we can trust God to provide for us. Indeed, it is a simple truth but many of us can sometimes find our trust wavering or even non-existent at times either through our own pride or through fear that we let creep into our lives.

Faith is a gift from God who provides all things for us. As God provided as He promised to Abraham, the Israelites, and the disciple, we can trust Him to continue to provide for us. We can be like vigilant servants, ever ready for the realization of what we hope for. Our waiting will not be in vain.

The Holy Eucharist is our nourishment as vigilant servants, as it is Christ Himself and a foretaste of the Heavenly Banquet and eternal union we are offered in Him. As evidence of things we have yet to see, Jesus' self-gift in the Blessed Sacrament grows and deepens our trust if we receive Him with love.

-HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION – This Friday, August 15 is the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary into Heaven, body and soul. It is a Holy Day of Obligation, meaning that the faithful are obliged (required) to participate in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass that day or at a Vigil Mass the evening before celebrating the Solemnity.

To disregard this obligation is seriously (mortally) sinful, severing our union with God which can only be restored through the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

Mass times for each Parish for this Solemnity are as follows:

At Holy Family – Thursday evening, August 14, 7:00 p.m. Vigil Mass; Friday, August 15, 8:30 a.m. Mass and 5:30 p.m. Mass.

At St. Thomas – Thursday evening, August 14, 5:30 p.m. Vigil Mass; Friday, August 15, 7:00 p.m. Mass.
