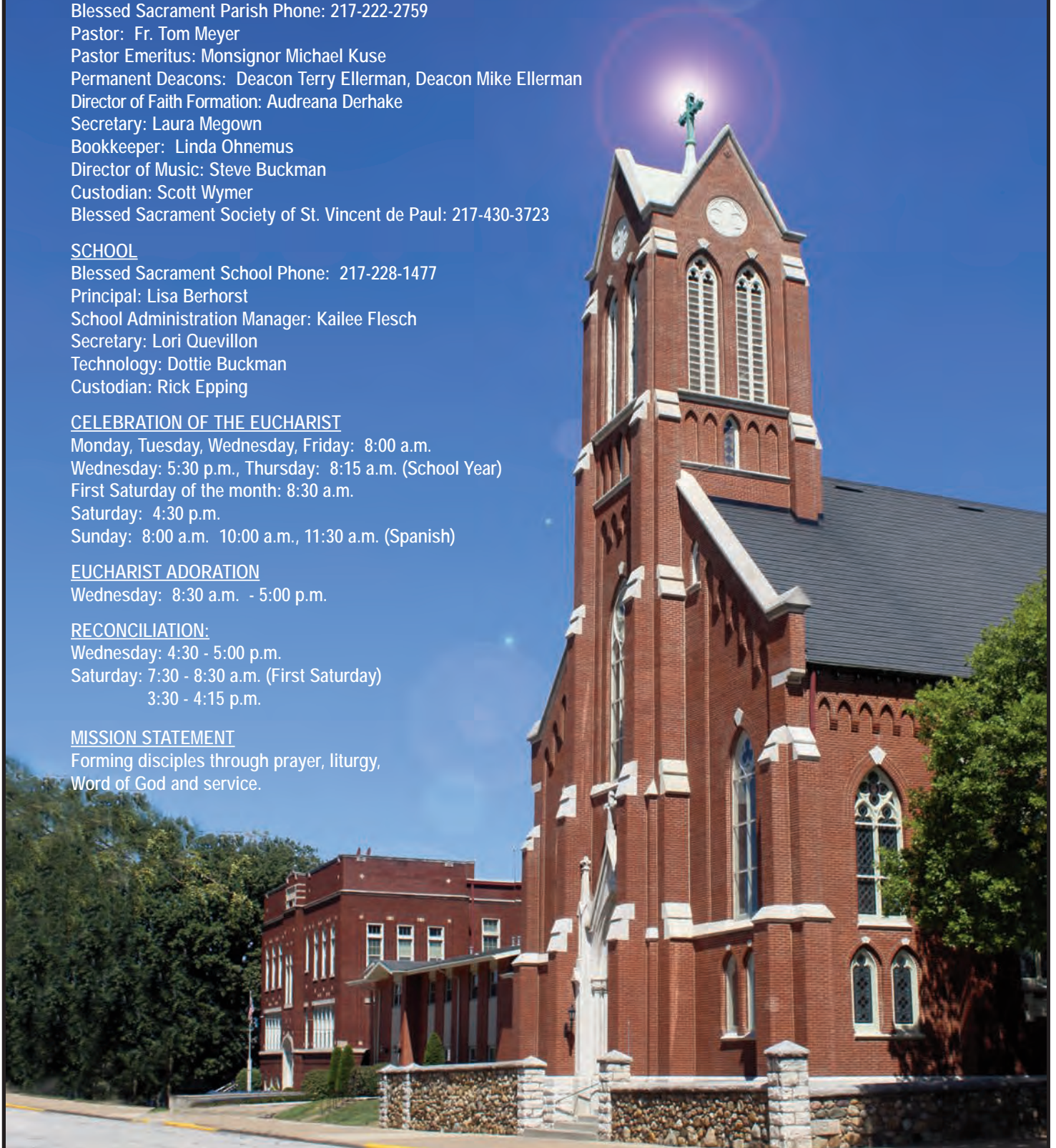

From the Pastor's Desk

Today we celebrate the **20th Sunday in Ordinary Time**. "I have come to set the earth on fire, and how I wish it were already blazing!" In the gospel Jesus surprises us with his desire for "fire" rather than "peace". Often the greatest obstacle to the spreading of the Gospel is complacency. We become too settled in our daily routines and lose the enthusiasm for being a disciple of Jesus Christ. May the "fire of Christ" shake us out of our sleep, and wake us up to lives filled with Christian joy and passion.

I wanted to officially communicate that Blessed

Sacrament will be launching a **parish-wide Capital Campaign this Fall**. This campaign is in response to a Springfield Diocesan initiative asking all parishes to participate to help meet the needs of our Parish, School, and Diocese. I am happy to report that we have two fantastic Co-Chairs who have been leading the preparations thus far - **Katrina Casper and Nathan Holtschlag**. I again want to thank them and all of our volunteers for their several months of hard work to bring us to this point. And I want to ask you to **pray** for the success of this Capital Campaign. Any success we have as a Blessed Sacrament family is due to the loving grace and providence of God. Success in my mind would be that this campaign might draw us closer to one another and to our Lord and our Blessed Mother.

This upcoming Tuesday, August 19 is the First Day of School at Blessed Sacrament School! We are excited to be back in school. I am grateful for the hard work that our principal Lisa Berhorst and her fantastic teachers and staff have done this past summer in getting our classrooms and curriculums ready for our incoming students. It's wonderful to start a brand new school year again at Blessed Sacrament School.
