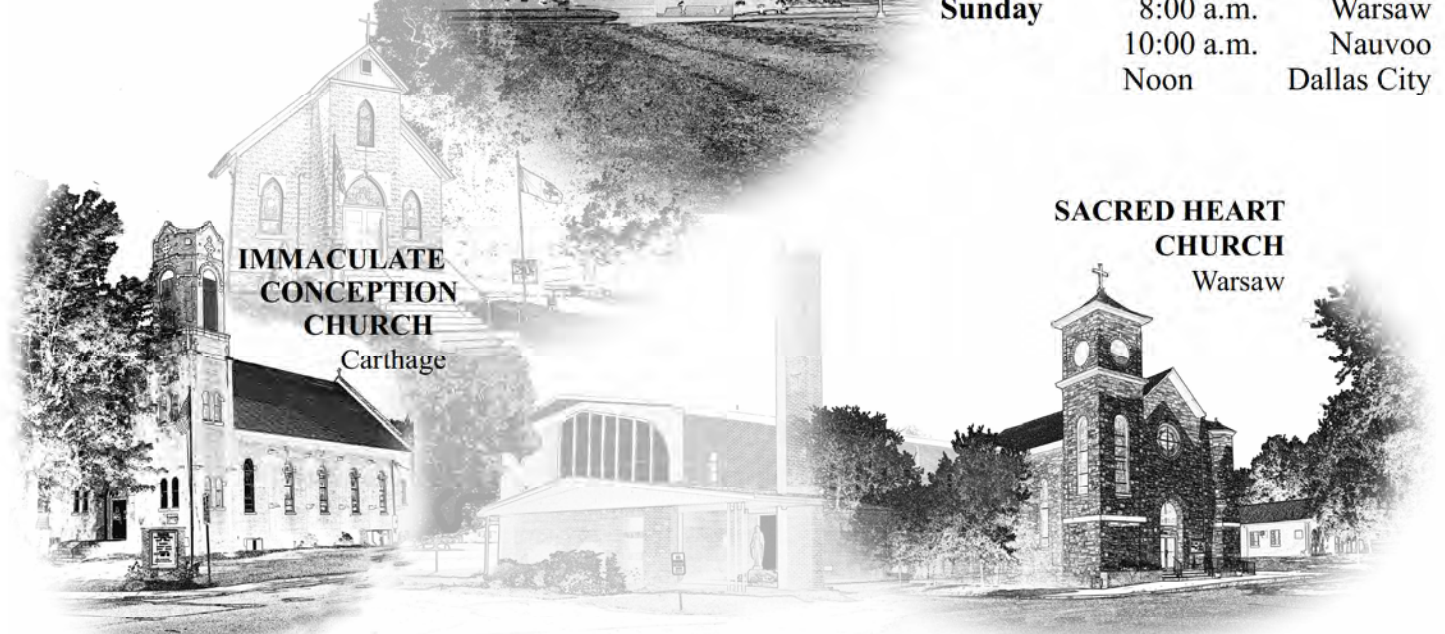

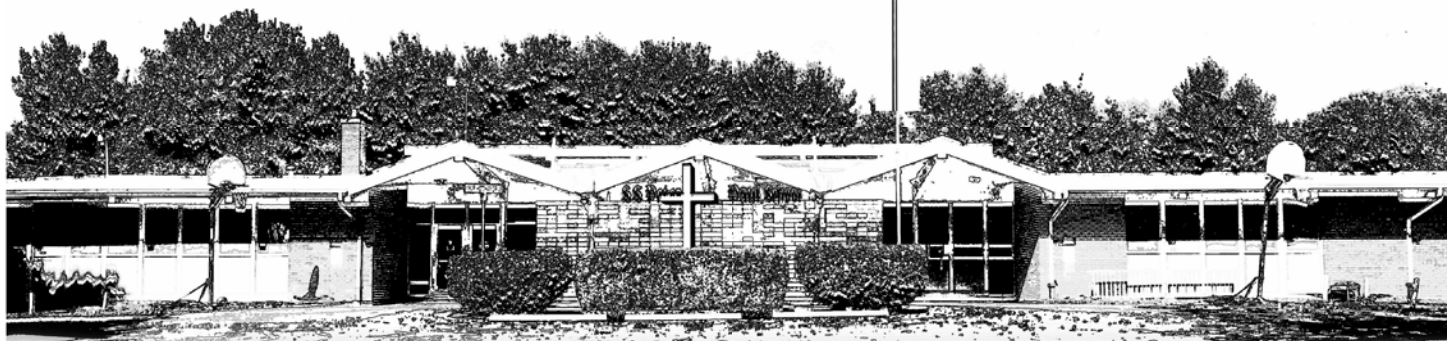

Peter and Paul Church site? What about activities at the other church sites? What can be kept separate and distinct for each church site? What needs to come together as one? What can...or should...or will, either way...remain separate? How much flexibility does Growing Disciples and the Bishop give to the pastor for any of this? We'll be letting you know about all of this, during the coming weekends.

And don't forget our parish initiatives: OCIA (formerly RCIA), CCD, Annulments, Youth Group, etc. Some ministries that I've reserved for myself over the years, are now the ministries of trained lay people of our parish, which we will present to you, with appropriate explanations.

In the meantime, we understand that our parishioners could well have questions that have already been answered: that's a given. Don't be shy about asking what you need to know. There are many things that never occur to your pastor to even think about. Your questions could well keep him alert to something worthy of being addressed, even repeated, for the benefit of all. Fr. Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, the healing ministry of Mr. Roger Shaner, the sacraments of Penance and the Anointing of the Sick, and intercessory prayer to Bishop Fulton Sheen (and the possibility of a miracle that advances his cause for sainthood) move to our IC Church site, beginning shortly after the 4 p.m. Saturday evening Mass, on the third Saturday of each month.
