Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

AUGUST 17, 2025

Jeremiah 38:4-6,8-10; Hebrews 12:1-4;
Luke 12:49-53

The Lord came to bring peace. But division often results. This world does not want to listen to a hurtful truth. Jeremiah (about 620 B.C.) was not nicey-nice. He told Israel that it was so rotten that it would be destroyed. For this, the leaders of the nation plotted to put him to death.

The second reading tells us that Jesus endured the opposition of sinners. He was crucified because the Gospel was a threat to political and religious leaders.

In today's Gospel, Jesus says that he came to light a fire on earth; he saw that the fire would cause division. What about us? Are we really interested in truth, or are we more interested in feeling good? Do we want a faith that confronts and challenges us to change?

Or do we prefer to remain in our comfortable spiritual rut? Do we dare to accept the challenge of a daily struggle with the world? Or do we rationalize and compromise.

Change is traumatic to the human psyche. And spiritual change is traumatic to souls. Yet the Lord challenges us each day to seek to become saints.

His message may be uncomfortable. His message may make waves and cause divisions. But his message is true. If we accept his message, his complete rule over our lives, then and only then will we find true peace and joy.

Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time, August 17, 2025

Dear Parishioners,

As we celebrate the 20th Sunday in Ordinary time, this weekend brings a mixture of feelings in the lives of many of our parishioners. First, there is a bit of sadness as this weekend brings our summer vacation to a close. And in so doing we ask ourselves what happened to this time as it sure seemed to rapidly pass. Then we begin to look ahead at the beginning of school, a time that will bring routine once again in our lives, a time for study, making new friends, and being challenged by teachers and parents. This time is also very busy with sporting events and extracurricular activities that involve proud parents and busy parents trying to keep up with all the activities of another school year. I keep asking myself, what happened to my summer, all those activities I promised myself that I would be doing and yet didn't. Maybe the standard response by most of us is maybe next summer. Whatever the case, our new school year here at St. Peter's begins this Tuesday, August 19, with an 8:05 a.m. start time and a 11:30 dismissal time. The first full day of school will be on Wednesday, August 20. These starting days and times are only for grades 1-8. The kindergarten and pre-school have special schedules. **I also want to remind you that when our school Masses start up again on Wednesdays, this Mass will begin at 8:20 and not 8:30 a.m. Please make sure this is a part of your calendar.**

I think that one of the most difficult gospels for us to understand is found in our gospel for this weekend. When we think of Jesus coming into the world, we often describe Him as the Prince of Peace. In fact, our image of Christ is one of love, mercy, forgiveness, all reflections of His peace. Instead, Jesus challenges His disciples to expect just the opposite. He asks today, "do you think that I have come to establish peace on the earth? No, I tell you, but rather division." These words I think are often unsettling, yet they describe the situation of the time. Many Jewish people who converted to the Christian faith, found themselves in a world of division. Their families, because of their conversion, ostracized them and could not even acknowledge them as members of the family. In an age of the importance of family, these converts understood firsthand the division of family because of faith in Christ. Furthermore, their Jewish faith excommunicated them from the synagogue, making them an outlaw religion, liable to arrest and death. The words of Jesus were not easy but did provide a comfort and strength for the early Christians. Perhaps our opening prayer gives us comfort as we prayed, "O God, who have prepared for those who love you good things which no eye can see, fill our hearts, we pray, with the warmth of your love, so that, loving you in all things and above all things, we may attain your promises, which surpass every human desire."

Just a reminder that the St. Peter Parish Picnic is next Saturday, August 23, from 5:00 p.m. to midnight. There are many activities planned, including good food and drinks, entertainment and raffles. 


