Isaiah 66:18-21; Hebrews 12:5-7,11-13;
Luke 13:22-30

Quite often, the theme of the Sunday Mass is summed up in the refrain for the Responsorial Psalm. Today the refrain is: "Go out to all the world, and tell the good news!" It is tough to keep the commandments of God. It is tough to stand up for morality in an indifferent world, or to stand for purity in a sex-crazy world, or to stand for peace in a violent world. It is tough to stand for integrity and honesty, for humility and charity.

But the toughest command of all (and the most neglected) is the command of God to go out to all the world and tell the Good News! We know that God loves all people. But people will know that God loves them *only* if we go out to tell them! We can't build enclaves around ourselves or close in on ourselves. We are responsible for the salvation of the world.

Today's first reading is from the last chapter in Isaiah. At the time this was written, much of Judaism had become smug, narrow-minded, and prejudiced against all non-Jews (Gentiles). The reading proclaims God's love for the "nations" (another word for Gentiles) such as Put, Lud, Mosoch, and Tubal. (These are roughly the table of nations around the Mediterranean Sea as listed in Genesis 10.)

In the Gospel, Jesus speaks of some who think that they are on the "inside" but who will find themselves on the "outside." They talk a good game of Christianity, but they fail to practice it. Perhaps it is because they have failed to consider their obligation to spread the Good News to their neighbor.

The second reading urges us not to be discouraged. We must not lose hope when we encounter difficulties. We should accept our crises as crosses, as our discipline from the Lord. Discipline may seem harsh, but it is for our own good. So straighten up and toughen out. Renew your zeal to be an instrument of God's Good News to the world.

21ST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

We are in the period of readings that challenge us greatly. The prophet Isaiah tells us of a time when all the nations will be gathered together on the mountain of the Lord, yes especially the Gentiles. He tells us of a sign that will gather them with dromedaries, camels, yes many see this as a prophecy fulfilled in the wise men. The sign is not just the star, but Jesus Christ, and He will gather all the nations, Jew and Gentile alike.

Jesus challenges us today with His discussion of salvation. He is asked, will only a few be saved? He then goes on about the narrow gate and how many will not be strong enough. Please remember we do not preach that everyone automatically goes to heaven. Salvation is not automatic, nor is it earned. It is a free gift that must be accepted and lived out. So many forget that even if one is judged for heaven, they may be in purgatory awaiting your prayers for God's grace. When we have the mentality of automatic straight to heaven for everyone, we lose sight of the need for a funeral and proper burial, as well as the need to pray for the dead. Many times a family has said, well mom didn't want a fuss about her, so she didn't want a funeral. The sad part of this is they think the funeral is about them, instead of about Jesus Christ's saving action for them. The offering of the Mass of Christian Burial is a powerful source of grace for the dead and needs to be followed asap by a proper burial. The funeral is the greatest gift we can receive in that moment, as the Mass is the most powerful prayer of the Church for the dead. Have Masses said for your loved ones. Pray for the dead. Pray for the poor souls in purgatory. And ask them to pray for you. This is all reinforced in the Gospel today.

Jesus gives us this parable about those standing outside, after the master has arisen and locked the door, and says Lord open the door for us. The master will say I do not know where you are from. We know you! We were with you! We ate with you. I do not know where you are from, depart from me evil doers. He says there will be many: Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob, and the prophets, and people from the north, south, east, and west. This is very challenging, but also very comforting. Salvation is not guaranteed. We must open ourselves to it, and we must live it out.

We may think we know Jesus, but do you really follow Him? So many call themselves Catholic, but do not practice or live it. They never clearly opened themselves to salvation, nor lived it out. This is a tough teaching Jesus gives us, but it should wake us up to follow Him. Yes, this includes the need to follow the commandments and precepts of the Church (which include the Mass and sacraments) at minimum. This passage is a comfort to know that many from all places in the world will be welcomed and dine with Him in heaven. We need to start following Him. How did He teach us to live it out, to serve Him and our neighbor?

What a great start to the school year! Continue to support our school, our teachers, our students, our parents, our staff, and our clergy, as we work to mold disciples of Christ.

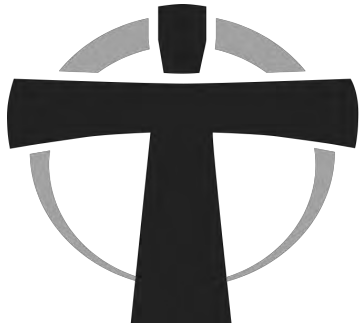
