## *Twenty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time*

AUGUST 24, 2025

Isaiah 66:18-21; Hebrews 12:5-7,11-13;  
Luke 13:22-30

Quite often, the theme of the Sunday Mass is summed up in the refrain for the Responsorial Psalm. Today the refrain is: “Go out to all the world, and tell the good news!” It is tough to keep the commandments of God. It is tough to stand up for morality in an indifferent world, or to stand for purity in a sex-crazy world, or to stand for peace in a violent world. It is tough to stand for integrity and honesty, for humility and charity.

But the toughest command of all (and the most neglected) is the command of God to go out to all the world and tell the Good News! We know that God loves all people. But people will know that God loves them *only* if we go out to tell them! We can’t build enclaves around ourselves or close in on ourselves. We are responsible for the salvation of the world.

Today’s first reading is from the last chapter in Isaiah. At the time this was written, much of Judaism had become smug, narrow-minded, and prejudiced against all non-Jews (Gentiles). The reading proclaims God’s love for the “nations” (another word for Gentiles) such as Put, Lud, Mosoch, and Tubal. (These are roughly the table of nations around the Mediterranean Sea as listed in Genesis 10.)

In the Gospel, Jesus speaks of some who think that they are on the “inside” but who will find themselves on the “outside.” They talk a good game of Christianity, but they fail to practice it. Perhaps it is because they have failed to consider their obligation to spread the Good News to their neighbor.

The second reading urges us not to be discouraged. We must not lose hope when we encounter difficulties. We should accept our crises as crosses, as our discipline from the Lord. Discipline may seem harsh, but it is for our own good. So straighten up and toughen out. Renew your zeal to be an instrument of God’s Good News to the world.

**Dear Parishioners,**

As we celebrate the 21st Sunday in Ordinary time, Jesus challenges us to “strive to enter through the narrow gate, for many, I tell you, will attempt to enter but will not be strong enough. After the master of the house has arisen and locked the door, then will you stand outside knocking and saying, ‘Lord, open the door for us.’” The door to eternal life, the gate to eternal life, is difficult. It involves a life of obedient service, and a life of embracing the cross. If we think we can enter that eternal life based only upon our faith, we will find ourselves “outside knocking and saying, Lord open the door for us.” It is then that the Lord will say to us in reply, “I do not know where you are from. Depart from me.” So, our Lords’ challenge is to strive to enter through the narrow gate. It is the gate that embraces a love for our God that makes present the love of our neighbor.




