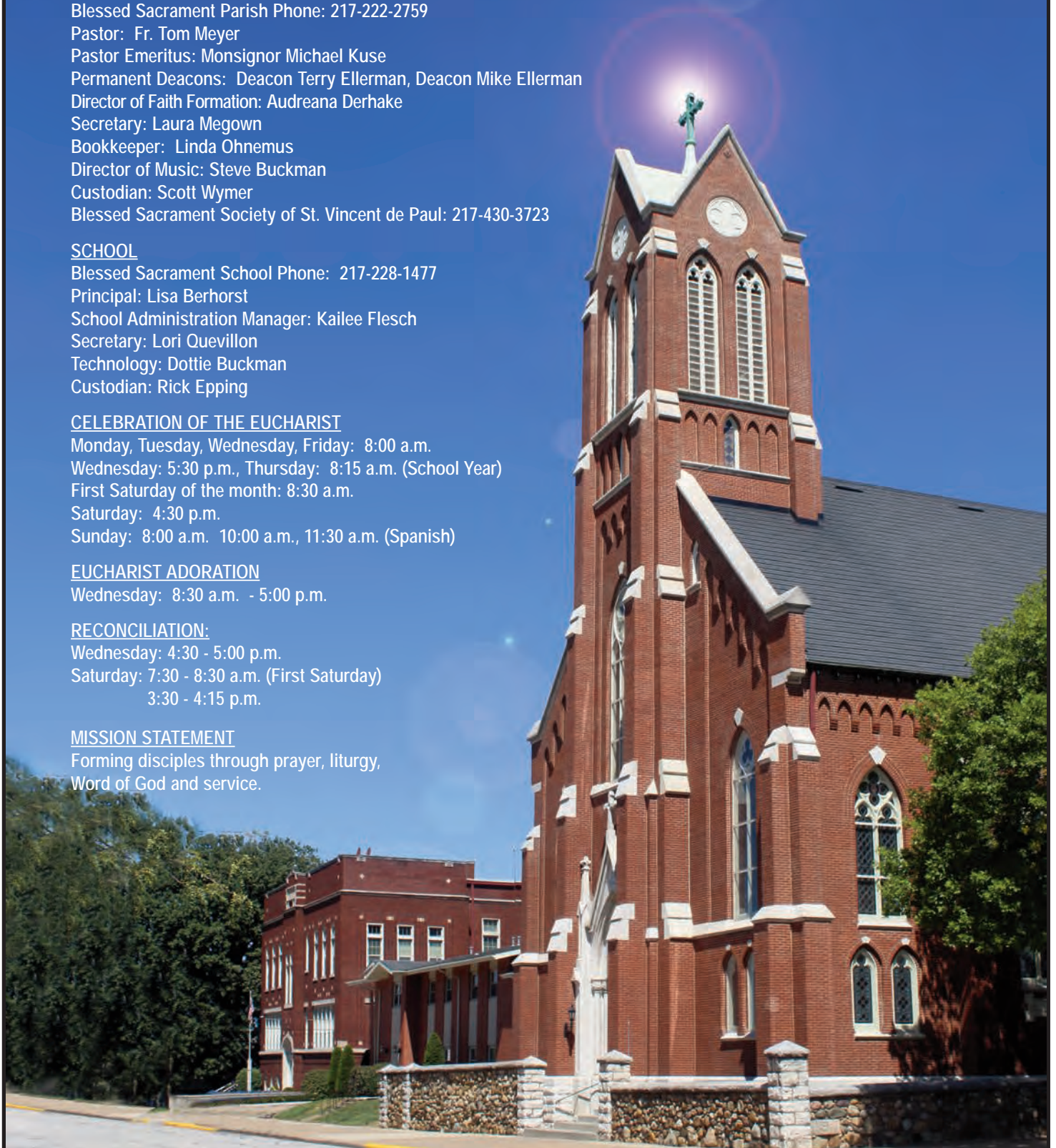

**From the Pastor's Desk**

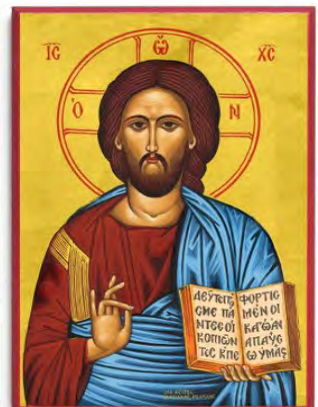
Today we celebrate the **18<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time**. In the gospel story we hear the Parable of the Rich Fool. The rich man has so much in abundance that he chooses to tear down his barns and build larger ones. Jesus tells us, "Take care to guard against all greed, for though one may be rich, one's life does not consist of possessions." We often compare our own wellbeing with the material wellbeing of others. This can become a source of personal unhappiness and resentment. Happiness comes not in building riches, but in building friendships that are rich in meaning.
