


The Solemnity of the Assumption, August 14/15. Preserved from Original Sin, with the grace of being able to exercise her human freedom perfectly because that's what freedom from sin does, Mary, the mother of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, experiences her Assumption, body and soul, into heaven. The Assumption of our Mother in the order of grace is an expression of veneration, love, and joy. It's also an anticipation of our own presence in heaven, body and soul, when Our Lord comes again. Our annual outdoor Mass on the Eve of the Assumption takes place on Thursday, August 14, at 5:30 p.m., at our Immaculate Conception Church site (Carthage) of our Holy Archangels Parish. Masses on Friday, August 15, will be 5:30 p.m. at Sts. Peter and Paul Church site (Nauvoo), and Noon at Sacred Heart Church site (Warsaw).

Wells Street Repair and Expansion Coming Soon. The first round of the major project on Wells Street involves the following dates: Tuesday, July 22, valve replacement at the corner of Wells and Young Streets; and beginning Tuesday, July 29, extension of a small part of our SPPS parking lot into the storm drain. 


