From the Pastor's Desk

Today the Church celebrates the Eighteenth Sunday of Ordinary Time. The First Reading from the Book of Ecclesiastes speaks of vanity and the toils of life. In the Second Reading, Paul exhorts the Colossians to leave behind earthly ways and pursue what is from above. In the Gospel, Jesus warns the crowds to take care against all greed and then tells the parable of the rich man who stored up all his goods but died before being able to enjoy them.

Much of our life is spent in toil, working to earn what we need to support ourselves and our families. Though this pursuit is necessary and good, the Lord reminds us not to fall into the trap of allowing work to become the sole foundation of our lives, particularly not to the extent that it leads us to forgo or delay building a life of discipleship.

-HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION – A reminder that Friday, August 15 is the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, a Holy Day of Obligation. The faithful are required to participate in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass on this day or at a Vigil Mass the night before. To disregard this obligation is seriously (mortally) sinful. The Mass schedule for this Solemnity will be in next week's bulletin.

-AUGUST 5 – Bishop Paprocki celebrates his birthday on August 5. Please keep him in your prayers. August 5 also marks the death anniversary of my father (this year 14 years). I remain so very grateful to my parents for raising me in the Faith and taking that responsibility so very serious. Please pray for all parents that they may lead their children in the True Faith.
