Ecclesiastes 1:2;2:21-23; Colossians 3:1-5,9-11; Luke 12:13-21

Wisdom means putting everything in its proper place in relation to our purpose in life. The old Baltimore catechism stated our purpose in a few words: "To know, love, and serve God so as to be happy with him in this life and in the next." We were created for God. True wisdom is to seek God and to serve him with all our heart. If we have any goal contrary to this goal, we shall not be happy and we shall not be wise.

But our full goal of eternal happiness was not known in ancient times. The author of Ecclesiastes knew that no earthly pleasure or possession could satisfy us. He knew that God was the answer, but he still knew nothing of heaven. For this reason he begins and ends his book with a rather despairing cry: "Vanity of vanities, and all is vanity!" You work hard, and for what? You will die and leave your wealth to others.

The man in the Gospel is likewise foolish. He lived only for this world. When he had a tremendous harvest, he decided to build bigger barns and to enjoy himself. Jesus calls him a fool, for he would die that very night.

For what do we work? What is our purpose in life? Do we really live as we say we believe? Do we try each day to love and serve the Lord? Do we live each day as if it is to be our last on earth? If so, we shall have peace. If not, we shall probably be miserable.

Our second reading fits in with this theme: Set your hearts on higher things. You have been baptized into Christ. You live his life. You have died to sin, so don't return to it. Put to death anything which would keep you away from God. You are a new person, a new creation in Christ: Live as one!

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend, we begin the month of August. As we begin this month, our thoughts turn to the start of another school year. I ask you to consult this bulletin and any letter from our principal with regard to the start of another school year. This is especially significant with the construction taking place with our building project. I just want to highlight the Mass on Sunday, August 17 with our parents and students invited to this kickoff for a new school year. After this Mass, our students and parents will be able to go to the school to meet their teachers and get acquainted with their new surroundings. Our first day of school will be on Tuesday, August 19 with early dismissal at 11:30 a.m. This will be for grades 1-8 with a special schedule for pre-school and kindergarten. Please consult the letter from the school for these dates and times. Welcome to another school year here at St. Peter School.

As many of you know from mere observation, I have been dealing with the aftereffects of a partial knee replacement. This occurred a short time after Easter. Physical therapy has gone well, and I am managing to get along better with the use of a cane. In the midst of this challenge for me, it was discovered that I have another challenge, enduring a struggle with ascites. This is basically liquid that forms in the stomach area for which I need a paracentesis, meaning that they tap my stomach and drain the liquid. The first two times that this has happened, they drained four liters off, and I was feeling pretty good. However, when they sent the liquid to the cytology lab, they discovered that I had malignant cancer cells in the liquid. So, after several visits to Barnes Siteman cancer center, and a number of visits with doctors in Quincy, they could not locate the source of the cancer. I seem to be somewhat of an anomaly. It was decided that I should undergo chemotherapy to try to control and destroy the cancer cells. So, in a week or so, I hope to begin this therapy. The reason that I am sharing this with you is to ask for your prayers. And the second reason that I am sharing this with you is that I am told the side effects of the chemo will leave me in a position of weakness, fatigue, and other side effects that are not very appealing. This way you will know if you don't see me at Mass or other things, there are reasons for my absence. I've been told by many that I need rest during this treatment plan because I will not be able to keep my usual pace. As I said, I don't want to make excuses but if I'm not available for things, you will know the reason why. So please pray for me as I will pray for you and together, we will get through this challenge in my life. Thank you!

I do want to thank all those who responded so generously to the Missionary Appeal as we collected \$2,565 toward this appeal. Once again you have reflected what it means to be a stewardship parish. Thank you for your generosity!

Our building construction continues as our rain these past several weeks has put a damper on things. I wasn't sure we might be having a swimming pool with the huge hole that is between the school and Church. As soon as things begin to dry out more, our workers will be present creating a structure for which we all can be proud. I just continue to ask that you continue your pledges and help us see it to completion.






