The spirit of faith is completely opposite the spirit of this world. This world tells us that you are what you make of yourself. This has a true sense, for we must work to achieve anything in this world. But our faith tells us that God's grace and love must come before any action of ours.

Surely, we must always cooperate with God's grace, but his moving grace comes first. The world emphasizes positive self-image; just imagine that you can be someone, and you can become what you want. But faith tells us that we must first of all have a "God-image." We must realize that God loves us with an everlasting love.

Although we may be nothing of ourselves and by ourselves, God has given us a precious, intrinsic dignity as his children. Although we are weak and sinful, God calls us to be perfect. And he empowers us to achieve this holiness. Except for God's grace, we are woeful sinners. But in his grace we can do all things.

This world would have us measure ourselves by our accomplishments; the worldling wants to call attention to himself. Faith teaches us to keep our good deeds secret, to call attention only to God's glory.

Our faith life begins with humility. Humility is truth. It is a recognition that, before God, we are nothing. Humility does not hide our faults nor our talents. But humility recognizes that all our talents come from God, and all our faults are from ourselves.

Humility can be faked. Sometimes people want to appear to be humble, whereas they are really arrogant hypocrites. Uriah Heep comes to mind. Politicians also put on the "humble act" around election time. They want to appear to be of the common people, whereas often they are filled with pride. Today's Mass is a meditation on humility. Let us daily pray for this gift, which is the basis of all other virtues.

Twenty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time, August 31, 2025

Dear Parishioners,

Well, this weekend we bid our month of August a very healthy goodbye. After a summer filled with heat, moisture, and humidity, it's good to say our goodbye to this month that seemed both short and long at the same time. It was short as we introduced it into our summer months with only two weeks before school, and yet it seemed like forever as the weeks before school slowly brought summer vacation to a close. Whatever the case, we can all be thankful that August is over and that September will be introducing its own challenges ahead. I know on a personal level, I will remember August as it introduced me to my first series of chemotherapy. Needless to say, it will be an experience that I will remember.

In our gospel for this weekend, Jesus is not giving us advice on proper table etiquette but rather to somehow humble ourselves in various circumstances and not think of ourselves as most important. We are, in a sense, to become like Jesus Himself, imitating Him as He would reach out to those often who are invisible and make them feel important. These were the sinners with whom He enjoyed a meal; these were the lepers, those ostracized but Jesus stretching out His hands and including them again; and these were you and me, those people whom Jesus stretched out His hands on the cross and died for all of us. Jesus' life was not about exclusion from our community but always involved a challenge to include them. Sometimes this was comfortable, other times it was not comfortable. But it wasn't our comfort zone that was important to Jesus but rather His. And so, our gospel is the desire that Jesus wants us to live; in a spirit of humility and self-giving for anyone who is hurting in any way. And we are able to do this as we draw upon His strength and not our own.

This Monday, September 1, is Labor Day. God has given to each of us a special gift called our labors and our talents. This gift is given to us for which we take much pride and joy. And so we gather on this Labor Day to thank God for that gift of labor. Our Mass on Labor Day will be at 9:00 a.m. Come and join us as we thank our God for that gift of Labor in our lives.

After two weeks off, I begin a new series of three chemos on three consecutive weeks. After my last one, I found myself in need of a blood transfusion which I had this past Monday. I just know it continues to take its toll on me, so I am presuming that it is working. Since I am beginning to feel the loss of my hair, I decided to cut it short so I don't have to contend with its remnants on my shirts and pillows. I only share my experience with you just to keep you informed and to continue to ask for your prayers.

There are times that people from our families or perhaps in our neighborhoods have shown an interest in the Catholic faith. It might be a question that they have asked of us in the past, or some other kind of inquiry which might show an interest in learning more about the Catholic faith. This is the time that we can be "evangelizers" of our faith, meaning people who are willing to share what we have with others. One way of doing this is by encouraging these inquirers to join what is called the OCIA, or Order of Christian Initiation of Adults. This is the group that shares our knowledge of the Catholic faith with people who might be interested in learning more. We meet every Tuesday from 7:00-8:30 until Easter in the Martha Jane Room which is off of the cafeteria in the basement of the Church. Our first meeting is Tuesday, September 9. There is no pressure to join but what is asked is an openness to learn. Please consider inviting people who might have shown an interest.




