Exaltation of the Holy Cross

SEPTEMBER 14, 2025

Numbers 21:4-9; Philippians 2:6-11;
John 3:13-17

St. Helena, mother of the Roman Emperor Constantine, went to the Holy Land in the early part of the fourth century. With her excavators, she found what were thought to be the relics of the true cross. A magnificent Church was erected which encompassed both Calvary and the tomb of Christ.

The tomb was (and is) located under the immense central dome. The Church was dedicated as the Church of the Holy Sepulcher. It is also known as the Church of the Resurrection and the Church of the Holy Cross. Some of the relics of the cross were brought back to Rome, but a large part of the cross was kept at Jerusalem.

In 612, Persians despoiled the Holy Land, and captured the cross. Later, in 614, the true cross was brought back and enthroned again in the Church. Today's festival originated with the dedication of the Church, but it also celebrates the finding and the return of the true cross. More than this, we celebrate our redemption which came about through the cross of Jesus Christ.

Our first reading tells the story of the bronze serpent. The Israelites had been disobedient; in punishment, fiery serpents attacked them and many died. They cried to the Lord, who had Moses erect a bronze serpent on a pole. Whoever looked upon the serpent was healed. The story has the mark of legend and magic, but it is a "type" or symbol of the cross which was to come.

In the gospel, Jesus says that he must be "lifted up" just as the serpent was lifted up in the desert. By "lift up" John means his lifting up on the cross in suffering and death, his lifting up from the tomb in the resurrection, and his lifting up into the glory of the Father. The gospel also gives the most famous verse in the Bible: "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son..." We have confidence in salvation because of the love of God shown in Christ Jesus.

The second reading was an ancient hymn before Paul incorporated it into his letter to the Philippians. It expresses the paschal mystery: Although he was God, he did not cling to equality with God. Rather he emptied himself to take the form of slave, being born as man. But he became humbler yet: Christ became obedient even unto death on the cross. Therefore God has exalted him! We must live the paschal mystery of Christ: We must share his cross, die to self, and live to God, confident that he will raise us to the glory of Jesus.

This weekend we take a step out of Ordinary Time and detour to the Exaltation of the Cross. This weekend we read the story of the serpents in the desert biting the Israelites in the book of Numbers. This bite is the sting of sin, and the only remedy is the Cross of Jesus Christ. The Gospel recalls this story from Numbers. The gift of the Cross is our salvation from the sting of sin. Let us look upon the cross and see the remedy we need. Let us embrace our crosses and unite them to Jesus and His Cross.



In the next few weeks we will begin a new initiative for praying for vocations. Every weekend during the announcements we will pass out a chalice that anyone in the parish can volunteer to take home. You will pray every day that week for vocations for our Church, to the priesthood and religious life specifically. If you can, include the hope of vocations from our parish to the priesthood and religious life. Pray with your family and friends throughout the week and see the gift of these vocations. Then bring the chalice back and whatever Mass the chalice returns will be the Mass we ask someone to take the chalice home.

Let us be a vocation-promoting parish!

Lastly, please pray for me and Father Ken as we attend our annual priests meeting this week. As stated in the bulletin, there will be no Masses Tuesday, Wednesday or Thursday. There also will be no confessions or adoration on Wednesday. There will be a communion service on Wednesday at 6:30 a.m. and 5:30 p.m.

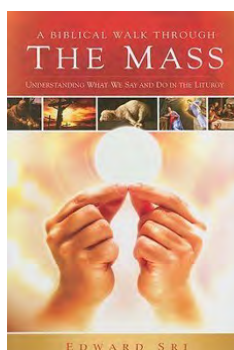

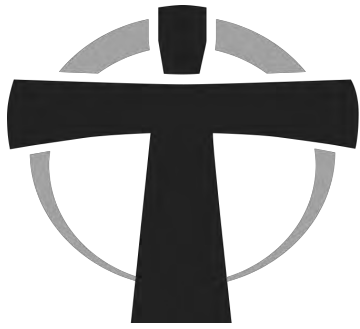
Ladies of St. Francis News:


