Exaltation of the Holy Cross

SEPTEMBER 14, 2025

Numbers 21:4-9; Philippians 2:6-11;
John 3:13-17

St. Helena, mother of the Roman Emperor Constantine, went to the Holy Land in the early part of the fourth century. With her excavators, she found what were thought to be the relics of the true cross. A magnificent Church was erected which encompassed both Calvary and the tomb of Christ.

The tomb was (and is) located under the immense central dome. The Church was dedicated as the Church of the Holy Sepulcher. It is also known as the Church of the Resurrection and the Church of the Holy Cross. Some of the relics of the cross were brought back to Rome, but a large part of the cross was kept at Jerusalem.

In 612, Persians despoiled the Holy Land, and captured the cross. Later, in 614, the true cross was brought back and enthroned again in the Church. Today's festival originated with the dedication of the Church, but it also celebrates the finding and the return of the true cross. More than this, we celebrate our redemption which came about through the cross of Jesus Christ.

Our first reading tells the story of the bronze serpent. The Israelites had been disobedient; in punishment, fiery serpents attacked them and many died. They cried to the Lord, who had Moses erect a bronze serpent on a pole. Whoever looked upon the serpent was healed. The story has the mark of legend and magic, but it is a "type" or symbol of the cross which was to come.

In the gospel, Jesus says that he must be "lifted up" just as the serpent was lifted up in the desert. By "lift up" John means his lifting up on the cross in suffering and death, his lifting up from the tomb in the resurrection, and his lifting up into the glory of the Father. The gospel also gives the most famous verse in the Bible: "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son..." We have confidence in salvation because of the love of God shown in Christ Jesus.

The second reading was an ancient hymn before Paul incorporated it into his letter to the Philippians. It expresses the paschal mystery: Although he was God, he did not cling to equality with God. Rather he emptied himself to take the form of slave, being born as man. But he became humbler yet: Christ became obedient even unto death on the cross. Therefore God has exalted him! We must live the paschal mystery of Christ: We must share his cross, die to self, and live to God, confident that he will raise us to the glory of Jesus.

The Exaltation of the Holy Cross Feast, September 14, 2025

Dear Parishioners,

Since this weekend falls on September 14, and since the 14th of September celebrates the Solemnity of the Exaltation of the Cross, our liturgy for today will be for this particular solemnity, the Exaltation of the Cross. According to legend, the True Cross was discovered in 326 by St. Helena, the mother of the Roman Emperor, Constantine the Great, during a pilgrimage she made to Jerusalem. According to tradition, Helena is credited with finding the true cross. She engineered an arduous dig in the vicinity of the Holy Sepulcher and was allegedly rewarded with the buried remains of the three crosses used the day Christ died. The wood was declared to be the wood of the true cross when a woman experienced a cure when it was applied to her. The Empress Helena enshrined the relics in a silver casket within the Church built for the purpose on that spot and also delivered a portion of it to Rome.

Perhaps the best summary of this particular solemnity is found in our second reading for our Mass today. Paul in his letter to the Philippians writes: *“Brothers and Sisters: Christ Jesus, though He was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God something to be grasped. Rather, He emptied Himself, taking the form of a slave, coming in human likeness; and found human in appearance, He humbled Himself, becoming obedient to death, even death on the cross. Because of this, God greatly exalted Him and bestowed on Him the name that is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, and of those in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.”*

We had our first class for those interested in learning more about the Catholic Church and its teachings. This is called the OCIA or Order of Christian Initiation of Adults. It meets every Tuesday from 7:00-8:30 p.m. in the Martha Jane Room, right off the cafeteria below the Church. Our first meeting had about 5 inquiring minds. If anyone else is interested, please come next Tuesday and join us. We have plenty of room and hopefully more inquirers.

Next week, most of the priests of the diocese will be attending a convocation of Priests at the Augustine Institute in Florissant, Missouri, from Tuesday to Friday, September 16 to 19. Because of my chemo treatments I have chosen not to attend. So we will continue to have our weekday Masses for this week. Just to keep you informed, this past week as well as next week, my chemo treatments will be on Thursdays. This is the only time that they could fit me into the treatment schedules.

Also, on Tuesday, September 23, Bishop Paprocki will be present in Quincy to celebrate our All Catholic Schools Mass at the QND gymnasium beginning at 9:30 a.m. All parishioners are welcome to attend and celebrate the opening of another year of learning at our Catholic schools. We have been privileged to have a pre-K through 12 years of Catholic education here in Quincy and our bishop will be here to acknowledge this gift that we have and to celebrate with us the Eucharist together. So come and join us priests, parishioners, teachers, and staff as we gather to celebrate together our Catholic identity.

As Catholics we are called to live our faith not only through prayers and devotions, but also by working to build peaceful and just societies. In the Jonglei region of South Sudan, ethnic conflict, cattle raiding, revenge killing, and violence against women and young girls have impacted thousands of lives. Amid these painful divisions, the Catholic Church is a trusted voice among the region's people. Recognizing this trust, the bishops of the Sudan and South Sudan Catholic Bishops Conference use their voice to call for peace and reconciliation among the people within their member dioceses.

The Diocese of Malakal, which includes Jonglei, is leading the way in building a sustainable and lasting peace by bringing together people in neutral locations to participate in dialogues, conflict prevention trainings, youth sports, and other relationship-building activities designed to help young people break the cycle of violence and retribution. 


