Amos 8:4-7; 1 Timothy 2:1-8;
Luke 16:1-13

Amos was a contemporary of Isaiah, Hosea, and Micah in the Eighth Century before Christ. He was a country boy from the south (Judah) who was called by God to preach to the wealthy and sophisticated north (Israel). He condemns Israel for its materialism.

The people had become attached to money and what it would buy. They did not like the "interruption" of the Lord's Day or Sabbath, for they wanted to get back to the business of making money. They cheated by adjusting their weights and measures. They cared nothing for the less fortunate. Amos warns them that God does not forget.

Very likely, the "Pastoral Epistles" (1-2 Timothy and Titus) were not written by Paul. They may have been written by a third or fourth generation Christian who realized that Christ would probably not come in glory very soon.

The message is that the Church must learn to live in this world. Even though the Roman government was alien to Christianity, the author urges that prayers be offered for all in authority.

The longer form of the Gospel tells of a corrupt business manager who is about to be fired. He gives kickbacks to his master's creditors so that they will take care of him after he is fired! Jesus laments that the people of "this world" are far more zealous in seeking their goals than Christians are. He tells us that we cannot serve two masters.

We have been entrusted with the riches of heaven. How sad it is that we are more concerned about the puny wealth of this world. If we don't use this world's goods for the glory of God, how can we be entrusted with the riches of eternity?

When we don't prepare for Mass, we reveal our misplaced priorities and rob ourselves of so much of the joy God wants to give us through the Eucharistic experience.

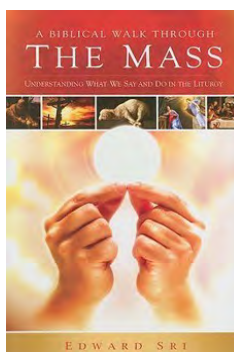

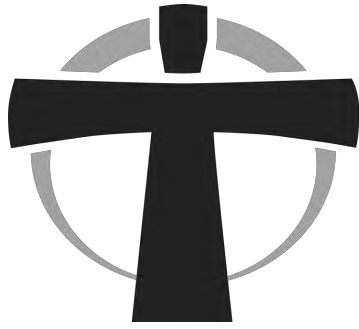
