Amos 6:1a,4-7; 1 Timothy 6:11-16;
Luke 16:19-31

Remember the old humorous statement: "The biggest problem in the Church today is apathy and indifference ... But who cares?" That may describe many of us. We are discouraged by the way things go in life, but we do nothing to change them.

Amos says, today, "Woe to the complacent in Zion!" That is a pretty weak translation. A better one would be: "The complacent are going to be damned to hell!" Not very nice words, but true! If we fail to notice needs and if we fail to try to fill those needs, we are complacent. We deserve eternal punishment.

The second reading tells us that if we are devoted to God, we must seek integrity; we must fight for faith; we must witness for Christ. This may be another way of saying that we can't save our own soul without saving others. We please God by showing our concern for the people and for the things God has made.

The big sin of the rich man in the Gospel parable is that he didn't notice poor Lazarus at his gate. He wasn't an evil person; he was just caught up in his own little world so much that he didn't notice the needs of others.

God offers us opportunities to serve him with our time, our talent, and our treasure. He doesn't overpower us, and he doesn't send us an angel or a vision. He expects us to notice. He expects us to see needs and to serve him by serving the needs of others.

Remember what the Lord says, "What you do ... or neglect to do ... to others, you do ... or neglect to do ... to me."

26TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ, this weekend's readings pierce our hearts with a sobering call to examine our lives. The prophet Amos thunders against the complacency of those who revel in luxury while ignoring the suffering around them. He warns of the consequences of self-indulgence, where the wealthy "lie upon beds of ivory" and feast lavishly, yet turn a blind eye to the needs of the poor. This is not merely a historical rebuke but a challenge for us today. How often do we, in our comfort, overlook the marginalized and suffering in our communities? Amos reminds us that God sees our indifference, and it carries a cost—exile from His grace if we fail to act with justice and charity.

In the Gospel, Jesus tells the parable of the rich man and Lazarus, a story that shakes us to our core. A story that lives out what Amos is speaking about. The rich man, clothed in fine linen and feasting sumptuously, ignores Lazarus, who lies at his gate, covered in sores and longing for scraps. It's not the rich man's wealth that condemns him, but his failure to see Lazarus as his brother, to share even a crumb of compassion. In the end, the chasm between them in the afterlife reflects the chasm the rich man built in life through his neglect.

My friends, this parable begs us to ask: Who is Lazarus in our lives? Who sits at our gates, unnoticed, in need of our love? Let us open our eyes and hearts, for in serving the poor, we encounter Christ Himself, and in ignoring them, we risk losing Him. May we choose mercy now, before the chasm becomes eternal.

This weekend we begin our stewardship renewal. I plead with you to take this time to renew your commitment to the Lord and how He is calling you to give of yourself. Take the time in prayer to consider what God is calling you to. Pray about your financial offering to the Lord. Pray about how He is guiding you to deepen your prayer life. Pray about how He is calling you to service.

Take the time to read through the renewal materials and to fill out your renewal card. **Please fill one out even if you don't think you need to.** It's a moment to recommit and it's a moment to take the temperature of the parish. You can fill out the card we send you or you may find it online. May we be good stewards of what God has given us.

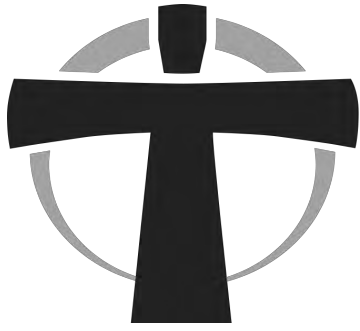
