Twenty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time

SEPTEMBER 7, 2025

Wisdom 9:13-18b; Philemon 9-10,12-17;
Luke 14:25-33

The Book of Wisdom was written about a hundred years before the birth of Jesus. Nevertheless, it pretends to have been written by Solomon, who lived nine centuries before Christ.

Today's first reading is taken from the so-called "Prayer of Solomon." Read the entire prayer for the context. In the prayer, Solomon acknowledges that he is called to build the great Temple, and that he is called to govern God's people. He knows that he is just like anyone else; he realizes how desperately he needs wisdom. He prays that God will guide him, for only God knows all things.

Philemon is the third shortest book in the Bible. Paul wrote this letter to Philemon to return Philemon's runaway slave, Onesimus. By law, the owner of a captured runaway slave could punish him even to the point of the death penalty. But Paul tells Philemon that Onesimus has become a Christian. Therefore, Philemon must treat Onesimus as a brother!

We can imagine Philemon's problem if he follows this advice: What will the other slaves think if Onesimus is treated as a brother? Philemon will have to treat them in the same way. And what will the other slave owners think? If all are called to treat each other as brothers and sisters, then slavery is dead!

Jesus says that it is more than just a "problem" to follow him. To follow him means the cross. If we aren't willing to suffer degradation, ridicule, persecution, and even death, we aren't really followers of Jesus.

Let us pray for true wisdom – a wisdom to follow the Lord loyally, whether it is popular or not. In the short run, following Christ is the cross. In the long run, it will be everlasting happiness and joy in the resurrection.

Twenty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time, September 7, 2025

Dear Parishioners,

As we gather on this first weekend of September, we gather and celebrate the 23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time. In our gospel today, Jesus says some very disturbing statements. To the crowds that were following Him, He turns and says, “if anyone comes to me without hating his father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, and even his own life, he cannot be my disciple.” That statement I am sure shook the crowds because family was very important for a Jewish person. And now we are to “hate them” as Jesus states. Then He continues as He asks us to hate our own lives. Finally He asks us to renounce all our possessions. If we were to put this forward as the cost of discipleship, not sure how many people would be following Christ. It seems to go contrary to what seems to be important for us.

What Jesus is trying to say, in these rather bold statements, is that you and I can be consumed by any one of these things in our lives to such an extent that we stop looking at Jesus and orienting our lives toward Him. A life of discipleship is a life oriented toward God and striving to be faithful to Him. The key, therefore, is not that we are literally asked to give up our family, or our possessions, or even ourselves, but that we are willing to give these things up for the love of God. It is our willingness that makes all the difference. Discipleship requires sacrifice. It requires the willingness to give up everything for the love of God, to be able to say “yes” to our God whenever we are asked.

This Tuesday, September 9, begins what we call the OCIA process for our parish family. This is a weekly encounter, helping people grow in their knowledge and understanding of the Catholic faith. People are invited to these classes who are interested in learning more about the Catholic Church, its teachings, its faith, its morals. Each Tuesday we grow in our faith from 7:00 to 8:30 p.m. For those who might be interested, I want to remind you that there is no pressure to join, only a willingness to learn. Then we let God take over and with His grace hopefully complete the conversion experience. But if not, that’s okay also. We let God take over and do not force anything upon anyone. I consider our OCIA classes very informative, challenging, and enlightening. This is an opportunity to ask questions and learn about the Catholic faith. Remember, first class is next Tuesday in the Martha Jane Room off the cafeteria in the basement of the Church starting at 7:00 p.m.

I began my second series of chemotherapy treatments last Tuesday. This series will also be three treatments in three consecutive weeks provided my system can take them. I still get extremely fatigued from them and find myself not being able to do the things I originally used to do. And that is frustrating to me! Please keep me in your prayers as I keep you in mine.

This Monday, September 8th, is the birthday of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Our liturgy is very consistent as we celebrate her Immaculate Conception on December 8, nine months before her birth. If we want to find the perfect human being who said “yes” to God in all her sacrifices, it is the Blessed Mother who is our model and our example.


