Twenty-eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

OCTOBER 12, 2025

2 Kings 5:14-17; 2 Timothy 2:8-13;
Luke 17:11-19

Today we meditate on “arrogance and gratitude.” Our first reading is the “rest of the story” of Naaman the Syrian leper. In the beginning of the story, Naaman, an important Syrian general, was a leper. His wife’s Israelite slave-girl told him that it was too bad he didn’t live in Israel, for he could be cured.

Naaman went to the king of Israel loaded with rich gifts and with a letter from his king. The letter said, “Here is my servant Naaman; cure him.” The king of Israel was beside himself. He thought that the king of Syria (or Aram) was just trying to pick a fight.

At this point, Elisha sent word to the king of Israel to send Naaman to him. When Naaman came, Elisha didn’t even go outside his house. He sent word for pompous Naaman to go and wash seven times in the muddy Jordan River. Naaman was indignant at first. But finally he humbled himself and did as he was instructed.

This is where today’s story begins. Naaman is a changed man. Not only was his leprosy cured; he also received spiritual healing. Now he is a humble, grateful man who praises only the God of Israel.

Our Gospel reading tells of Jesus’ cure of ten lepers. Not one of them came back to thank Jesus except a Samaritan. Jews hated Samaritans as half-breeds and heretics. But this Samaritan humbles himself to return to the hated Jews and give thanks.

Sometimes we can be very smug in our religion. We think that God owes us everything. We often take God and our faith for granted. God wants us to realize that he is the source of every good and perfect gift. We must humble ourselves before him and show our thanks for all that he does for us.

The Christian spiritual life is a life of stewardship: We recognize God as the giver of all blessings, and we try to thank him by our life of service.

Twenty-eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time, October 12, 2025

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend we celebrate the 28th Sunday in Ordinary Time. As the numbers in “ordinary time” increase, the liturgical year is indicating that this year of our Lord is coming to an end. This year there are 33 Sundays in this time called “ordinary” with the last Sunday of the liturgical year always being the Solemnity of Christ the King, which is November 23. As we travel through this “ordinary time” let’s always remember that time is a gift given to us from our God and hopefully have His grace to use it wisely in whatever time is given to us.

Our readings today deal with a disease that affected many and knew neither age nor religious upbringing. It was called “leprosy.” Whether this “disease” was actually “Hansen’s disease,” which is the modern day term for this actual disease or perhaps it was used to describe a type of skin disease, we really don’t know. But it is presented to us as a factor that would ostracize people from their community, separating them for fear of infection. Whatever the case, these people were treated horribly. In our first reading for this Sunday, we find Naaman, a man affected by leprosy, but not of the faith of Israel, seeking a cure from the God of Israel. Through the prophet Elisha, he was told to wash in the Jordan river. Reluctantly, he refused, thinking that the rivers of his home country were a lot cleaner than this river of Israel. But in this story of Naaman, we find him unable to humble himself for the cure of his disease. Instead, he tried to control his cure. It took a young person to encourage him to follow the directions of the prophet and when he did, he found his cure for which he longed. In our reading today, he returns after being cured to the prophet to thank him for this healing. As the Scriptures states, “his flesh became again like the flesh of a little child, and he was clean of his leprosy.” So now he returns to thank Elisha for this gift and to proclaim “now I know that there is no God in all the earth, except in Israel.” And then Naaman presents Elisha with a gift of thanksgiving. Our gospel for this weekend is also a story of leprosy and the cure that was made present through the power and healing of Jesus. But in this story, we find nine people cured of this skin disease. Only in our gospel, Jesus highlights that the only one who returned to thank Jesus for the cure was a non-Jew, a Samaritan. This is where Jesus remarks, “Ten were cleansed, were they not? Where are the other nine?” Jesus heals us of our diseases of the flesh, often times called sins. He heals us through His forgiveness and mercy. How grateful to God are we for the miraculous healing that takes place through the forgiveness of sins. Let us always be a people of thanks for what God does for all of us.

Once again, I want to encourage you to celebrate with us our S’More Fun on Sunday, October 19 from 6:00-7:30 p.m. on campus by Seton Hall. The evening will include S’mores Stations, live music, hot dogs and chips, hot chocolate, and even a hayride. Please consult the bulletin for further details.

Also, October 19, the St. Peter’s Eucharist Revival Ministry will be having an Eucharistic Mission from 12:30-3:30 p.m., with differing people providing witness talks, Eucharistic Adoration, and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. I encourage you to make this day special and reenergize you in our Eucharist.


