

As Christians, we keep Sunday holy because it is the day of Christ's Resurrection, and the eighth day of creation, when new life begins. Sunday rest isn't just about taking a break from work; it's about making space for God, family, and renewal. When we attend Mass, spend time in prayer, and enjoy unhurried moments with loved ones, we honor the Lord's Day. In a world that prizes constant busyness, choosing to rest on Sunday becomes a quiet act of faith – a reminder that our worth lies not in what we do, but in Whose we are.

Annual Financial Statement Narrative

Good morning, my name is Frank Flesch. I am a Blessed Sacrament Parishioner, school parent, and a member of our Parish Finance Council.

Today, in your bulletin, is the Financial Summary for our year that ended June 2025. At first glance, you will see that our Parish Expenses exceeded our Parish income by \$39,000 last year. In addition, this year's projected deficit looks to be significantly greater as our expenses continue to increase, but our giving is not increasing at the same rate.

This deficit is a result of a few items: the sunset of a grant that funded many school expenses and an overall increase of 7% in school salaries as mandated by the Diocese. Our greatest act of stewardship is our school and without our wonderful teachers and staff we wouldn't be able to accomplish the miracles that happen in our school everyday. So, without a doubt, in my mind and hopefully yours, this mandatory increase is well-deserved and necessary.

Next, I would like to bring special attention to the Annual School Fund, which shows an income amount of \$213,000. This amount includes a \$182,000 gift from a single source, the Klene Family Trust.

While I know that the majority of us are not fortunate enough to leave such a legacy, I would like to take this moment to ask if your family could help our Parish towards a specific, ongoing expense that we have.

Aside from our school, the largest expense for our Parish is the Tithing Goal from the Diocese. Our estimated tithing goal this year is \$65,000. This amount is based on the income the church receives, not the school. So there are 2 options to help defer this expense. Preferably, use the annual school fund envelopes on a monthly basis or you may contribute monthly to the regular parish support.

If each of our active Parish families could contribute an additional \$53 per month, we would cover our Diocesan Tithe and increasing expenses. This ask is for your ordinary giving, which keeps our parish and school operating on a daily basis, as compared to our Capital Campaign, which is an opportunity for extraordinary giving.

You, our parishioners, are wonderful stewards in all gifts- time, talent, and treasure. I want to thank each of you for providing a community of faith that feels like an extended family. I feel so blessed to be a part of this Parish and to raise my own children here. Thank you for this gift.
