Twenty-ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time

OCTOBER 19, 2025

Exodus 17:8-13; 2 Timothy 3:14—4:2;
Luke 18:1-8

Spiritual writers tell us that we pray to prepare ourselves to receive God's gifts. We do not pray to bend God's will. And we do not pray to remind him of his promise to do good to us. Nevertheless, today's Scripture readings seem to tell us to keep "nagging" God!

The first reading tells the story of a battle between Israel and its enemies in the Exodus. Moses prays with arms outstretched. As long as he keeps praying, Israel keeps winning. But when his arms get tired and droop, Israel falls back. So Aaron and Hur prop Moses' arms up so that Israel will keep winning.

The Gospel tells us the story about a little old widow who seeks justice from a corrupt judge. We can imagine her: about four feet high, in tennis shoes, rather shabby clothes, with an umbrella, perhaps. She keeps nagging at the corrupt judge. He won't decide in her favor because of the merits of her case. But he worries that the little old lady will beat him over the head with her umbrella! So he decides in her favor.

It is a parable, of course! The point is that we must keep "nagging" God. This means that we must persevere in prayer. Our perseverance will show that we depend entirely on God.

The second reading contains a beautiful expression about God's word: "All Scripture is inspired by God and is suitable for teaching, for refuting error, for guiding people's lives, and for teaching them to be holy."

When the author wrote these words, the only existing Scriptures were the Hebrew Scriptures or the Old Testament. But it is true of the entire Bible. St. Jerome said that ignorance of the Scriptures is ignorance of Christ! Let us make daily Bible reading a part of our spiritual life. Let us nourish our souls not only with the Eucharist, but with the Word of God.

Twenty-ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time, October 19, 2025

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend our Church calendar states that we are celebrating the 29th Sunday in Ordinary Time. As we are 3/4 of the way through our month of October, hopefully we begin to see changes in nature, as mother nature shows off her wonders in the leaves changing, and all of nature preparing itself for the colder weather. I only hope that all of us are able to experience this change as it prepares us for the winter months.

Our first reading is from the Book of Exodus. As I was thinking about this particular reading, one of the thoughts that I had was the posture of prayer. When I was growing up, the good Sisters taught us that one of the postures of prayer for me was folded hands. And so that became the standard by which all of us children used when praying. Hands folded, fingers together but not interlocked, and both hands out in front of one's chest. I remember that we were often corrected when this standard was not upheld by all of us. Then when I went to the seminary, we learned what became known as the Moses posture of prayer. As we celebrated the sacraments, our attention now was to have our hands outstretched in prayer. The reason for this narrative that I present again is from the Book of Exodus found in that first reading. We hear that Amalek came and waged war against Israel. Moses informed Joshua to engage in Battle with Amalek. And as the reading states: "As long as Moses kept his hands raised up, Israel had the better of the fight, but when he let his hands rest, Amalek had the better of the fight." "Aaron and Hur supported the hands of Moses, so that his hands remained steady til sunset." And so today, when the priests are praying the Eucharistic prayer, or any prayer, you will find the posture of his hands stretched out and raised up in imitation of the prayer of Moses. Whether hands folded or stretched out and raised, what is important is taking time to pray. Whatever posture we use should help us realize what we are doing and make sure that whatever we are doing, we are doing well.

I don't know about you, but I am really excited to hear the University of Notre Dame Glee Club who will be with us this Wednesday, October 22 at 6:00 p.m. in St. Peter Church. Their presence here in Quincy is in conjunction with the St. Peter Church Sacred Music Concert Series. Please join us for an evening of sacred and classical choral music. There will be a freewill offering taken.

Also, this Sunday, October 19, we will have our annual S'more Fun from 6:00-7:30 p.m. on campus by Seton Hall. The evening will include some live music, with differing S'mores stations, hot dogs, chips, hot chocolate, and even a hayride. However, families need to register. See the bulletin for further details.

Also, this Sunday, October 19, we will have our Eucharistic Mission from 12:30-3:30 p.m. with differing people providing witness talks, Eucharistic Adoration, and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. Fr. Steve Arisman, who was a part of the Eucharistic Revival in Indianapolis this past summer, will be one of those giving a witness talk. So please join us for the day and renew your devotion to the Eucharistic presence of Jesus and re-energize your batteries to remain close to the Lord in the Eucharist.


