## *Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time*

Sirach 35:12-14,16-18; 2 Timothy 4:6-8,16-18;  
Luke 18:9-14

The world operates on the “good ole boy” system: You do business with your friends. You scratch their back, and they’ll scratch yours. If you know someone in the system, you can get things done. If you have influence, the world is yours.

God doesn’t operate that way. Our first reading tells us that God doesn’t play favorites. He is not unduly partial toward the poor just because they are poor. And he certainly is not partial to the rich just because they are rich.

Actually, though, the Lord *does* show partiality: He is partial toward those who are humble, sincere, and to persons of complete integrity. But you can’t “fake it” with God! So be careful.

The Pharisee was known to be religious. He had the reputation of being a saint. But he is filled with pride. The tax collector (also called “Publican”) knew he was a sinner, but he is repentant. The Lord hears him and not the religious professional.

The second reading might be an occasion for discouragement. Paul had worked long and hard for the Gospel, yet he is about to be judged guilty with a death penalty. No one took his side in the court case. But he is not discouraged. Departure from this world will mean a crown of eternal glory for him.

Let us pray for honesty and sincerity in our faith. May the Lord help us to realize that we are nothing without him. May he make us persons of complete integrity and wholehearted service.

## 30TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Last weekend we heard about the persistent widow. This weekend is the continuation of teaching us about prayer and giving. In Sirach this weekend, we hear about how God hears the cry of the poor, the widow, and the orphan. He has such a heart for those neglected and suffering.

Stewardship is a multifaceted way of life. It is the life of a disciple. Prayer is at the core of stewardship. May we be those people who not only pray unceasingly but then be moved to respond to the urgings of our heart with actions. As the Lord hears the cry of the poor, the widow, and the orphan, so should we. Our prayer should move us to serve them, to care for them, to pray for them, to give to their needs, and to love them.

The Gospel shows what God is asking of us in giving. First, notice the gospel says that they came to the temple area to pray. Prayer is at the heart of giving. The Pharisee not only judged everyone in his prayer but then praised all the good things he was doing. He was at the central point for all to see. It was not about prayer. It was not about giving. It was about what he got out of it, which is looking pious and checking the boxes.

God is asking way more of us than just boxes checked. He is asking for your heart. The Lord is asking us to be more like the tax collector in the Gospel. Humble, Real, and Penitent. He is giving himself fully to the Lord to be transformed. So, let us be persistent and humble pray-ers. Let us be a people that respond to the call of prayer to serve the needs of the poor, the widow, and the orphan. Let us give to the needs of the Church so that we may care for the needs of Her people.

The first week of November we are going to change how we do the Mass attendance cards. Starting that weekend and from now on, instead of putting them in the collection you will bring them up to the priest who has the Mass. This is how I wanted it to be in the first place, but I wanted us to start out all the same. The reason that we're doing this is because it gives us an opportunity to make a connection with the kids on a more regular basis. The whole family doesn't have to come up to bring them to me but just have your child bring it up to us after mass. I think it brings an opportunity of real connection. I'm looking forward to that opportunity!

Lastly please keep the Diocese of Jefferson City in your prayers. A new Bishop has been appointed for them. His name is Bishop-elect Ralph O'Donnell. When I was in seminary at Conception Seminary College in northwest Missouri, then Father Ralph O'Donnell was the vocation director for the Archdiocese of Omaha, Nebraska. Eventually he became a formator at that same seminary, but that was after my time there. This week on October 28, Bishop-Elect O'Donnell will be ordained the fifth Bishop of the Diocese of Jefferson City. They are our neighbors to the west. Keep Bishop O'Donnell in your prayers as he prepares for ordination and begins his ministry as Ordinary of their Diocese. He is such a great man and priest and will be a great shepherd.

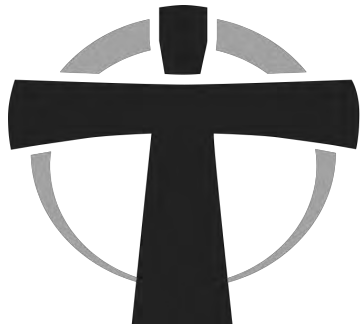
