Sirach 35:12-14,16-18; 2 Timothy 4:6-8,16-18;
Luke 18:9-14

The world operates on the “good ole boy” system: You do business with your friends. You scratch their back, and they’ll scratch yours. If you know someone in the system, you can get things done. If you have influence, the world is yours.

God doesn’t operate that way. Our first reading tells us that God doesn’t play favorites. He is not unduly partial toward the poor just because they are poor. And he certainly is not partial to the rich just because they are rich.

Actually, though, the Lord *does* show partiality: He is partial toward those who are humble, sincere, and to persons of complete integrity. But you can’t “fake it” with God! So be careful.

The Pharisee was known to be religious. He had the reputation of being a saint. But he is filled with pride. The tax collector (also called “Publican”) knew he was a sinner, but he is repentant. The Lord hears him and not the religious professional.

The second reading might be an occasion for discouragement. Paul had worked long and hard for the Gospel, yet he is about to be judged guilty with a death penalty. No one took his side in the court case. But he is not discouraged. Departure from this world will mean a crown of eternal glory for him.

Let us pray for honesty and sincerity in our faith. May the Lord help us to realize that we are nothing without him. May he make us persons of complete integrity and wholehearted service.

Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time, October 26, 2025

Dear Parishioners,

We might ask ourselves the question, where did our month of October go? It seems like we were just celebrating the conclusion of the month of September and now we are about to end the month of October. I guess the expression “time flies when you are having fun,” might be the theme of this month. Whatever the case, I am hoping that you are enjoying the changes of nature and admiring the beauty of God’s creation in its finest.

I find one of the most beautiful Scripture readings that we have is present for us today in our second reading from Paul’s letter to Timothy. In this letter upon which we can meditate, Paul writes, “I am already being poured out like a libation, and the time of my departure is at hand.” “I have kept the faith. From now on the crown of righteousness awaits me, which the Lord, the just judge, will award to me on that day, and not only to me, but to all who have longed for his appearance.” As we reflect upon Paul’s letter, we are reminded that our lives are being poured out like a libation, that our lives are meant to be an offering to our God, poured out not for ourselves but for Him. As far as a time of departure, our lives must always be ready to meet the Lord whenever He comes for us. We show our readiness by keeping the faith, hoping for that crown of righteousness that awaits all of us. May what Paul experienced in his life and shares with us be what each of us finds in our own personal lives. Keep the faith, remain hope-filled.

We want to welcome our students from QND who are celebrating their Homecoming weekend with us by celebrating the Eucharist together before their dinner and dance. As we celebrate Homecoming, our presence at the Eucharist reflects who we are and what we are about as a school. Thank you for being with us this evening. I pray for your safety and wise decisions.

Next Saturday is November 1, which is usually a Holyday of Obligation for us as Catholics. Because this Solemnity falls on a Saturday, the obligation to attend Mass is lifted. We will however have our statues of our saints in a prominent position to remind us of this celebration. Also, the following day is Sunday, November 2, the feast of what we call All Soul’s Day. This is the day that we remember all those who have died throughout our lives but in particular, we remember the parishioners who have died this past year. We will have a special candle-lighting ceremony at the 5:00 p.m. Mass on Saturday as a way of remembering our faithful departed. We will also have their pictures on our screens, helping us to remember them in prayer. Our prayer is that their souls and the souls of all the faithful departed rest in peace now and forever.

After the Saturday evening and Sunday Masses this weekend, the Social Concerns Committee will be collecting funds for Hayden Ware and her family. Hayden is a QND student and parishioner of St. Peter. Allow me to express my profound gratitude to you and your parish community for participating in the upcoming National Collection for the Archdiocese for the Military Services, USA (AMS).

As you know, the collection is approved by the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops to be taken every three years, to increase awareness and support of the mission, *“Serving Those Who Serve.”*

The ministries offered by the AMS benefit those who serve in all six branches of the U.S. Armed Forces, Veterans, and their families.

The mission of this Archdiocese is to ensure that service members, Veterans, and their families be able to seek sacramental preparation for baptism, confirmation, first Communion, penance, and marriage; to benefit from consultation with a priest, and to receive the sacrament of penance as they defend our rights of freedom and speech, and face constant transition and uncertainty.


In addition, the AMS Co-Sponsored Seminarian Program is the only vocations program in the United States that provides priests to serve as military chaplains and also to serve in parishes and dioceses across the country that struggle with their own critical shortage of ministers. When the priest separates from the military, he then returns to his diocese or community.

Please help me continue to provide for those entrusted to my pastoral care – including those who originate from your own parish or diocese - by including one or more bulletin announcements in your weekly publication, making collection envelopes readily available, and perhaps consider having an active-duty or retired military member of your parish offer a witness regarding his or her experience of receiving the sacraments or counsel from an AMS endorsed priest while serving on active-duty.

Please pray for an increase in vocations to the priesthood and religious life. Know that your intentions will be remembered at the altar.

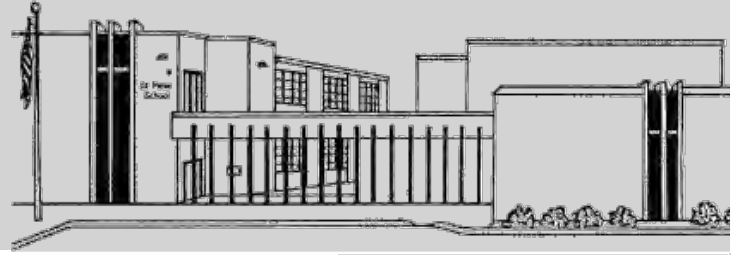

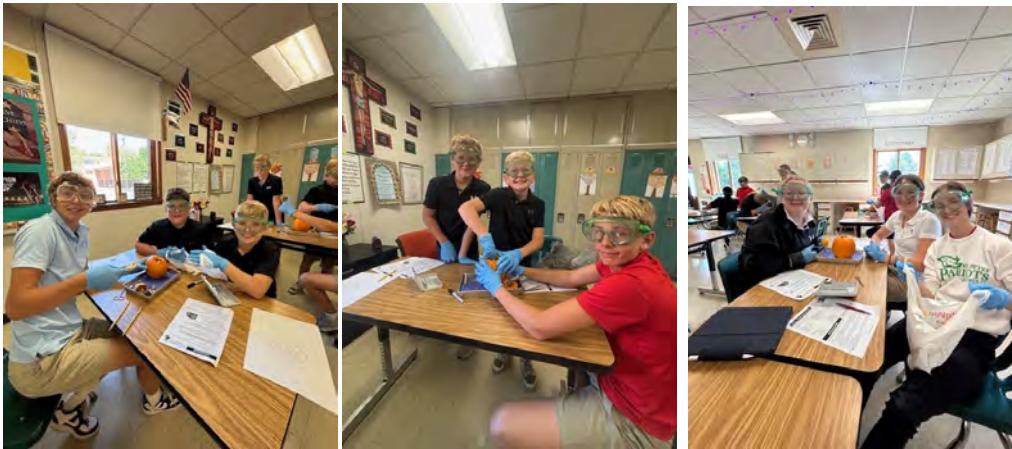


