Twenty-seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

OCTOBER 5, 2025

Habakkuk 1:2-3,2:2-4; 2 Timothy 1:6-8,13-14;
Luke 17:5-10

The key word today – found in all three Scripture readings – is *faith*. The first reading is a complaint against God for not intervening when we are in trouble. When things go wrong, we cry out to God, “Where are you? Why didn’t you do something when we were in trouble?” God’s answer is that we must wait with hope for his justice. The rash person lashes out and gives up. The righteous person lives by *faith*.

The second reading uses *faith* in a slightly different sense. By the time this epistle was written, there was a body of belief or doctrine. The author of 2 Timothy urges us to guard the “rich deposit of *faith*.” He means that we must always be loyal to the truths which the Lord has revealed. If we stick to those beliefs, we shall be saved.

In the Gospel, the apostles ask the Lord to increase their *faith*. He tells them that they could do almost anything if they had a little bit of *faith*. He then gets at the root of their problem: They always want everything to go their own way. This is the wrong attitude. They should want things to go the Lord’s way. They should serve him loyally and ask for nothing more.

They should not be servants who do their job and expect their master to wait on them. When they have lived with absolute loyalty and *faith*, they must still say, “We are merely servants; we have done no more than our duty.” Of course, if we live this way – in a spirit of real *faith* and loyalty to the Lord – he will richly reward us.

But we must not get the cart before the horse: We serve him because he is right. We do not serve him from a motive of reward, but simply because we want his will to be done. With this attitude, he will reward us for genuine *faith*.

Twenty-seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time, October 5, 2025

Dear Parishioners,

Well, we have begun a new month in our Autumn season, that of the month of October. This month should be filled with many signs of the presence of God in our midst as mother nature will begin her preparation for winter with the change of colors that will surround us. I hope that each of you makes a choice to view this change and enjoy the beautiful show that God will present in nature itself.

On this first weekend of October, the Church celebrates the 27th Sunday in what we call “ordinary time.” There are often times in our lives when crosses come our way, when difficulties seem to dominate our lives. Unfortunately, I have found myself in a similar situation with my struggle with cancer. There are times in our lives we just want to say to the Lord, “what’s going on?” Jesus understood the predicament of human beings and seems to challenge each of us. In our gospel, we find the apostles very perplexed with what was going on in their lives. They didn’t understand the things that were happening to them. And so they simply asked Jesus, “Lord, increase our faith.” How many times have we prayed for that in our lives. Even though we might be a person of faith, often times we are challenged to question our own level of faith as we pray, “Lord, increase our faith.” Our gospel tells us today that “if we have faith the size of a mustard seed, we could say to the mulberry tree, ‘be uprooted and planted in the sea,’ and it would obey us.” I would like to think that but perhaps my own lack of faith has me questioning this response of Jesus. But I will continue to trust in Him, knowing that I do not have all the answers and trusting that He does. Until we learn the answers and ask the right questions, we try to do what we have been commanded and say, “we are unprofitable servants; we have done what we were obliged to do.”

Our 8th grade students and their chaperones will be leaving this Sunday, October 5 for their annual trip to Washington D.C. I ask you to remember them in your prayers, asking their Guardian angels to watch over them and return them safely to us the following Friday.

The month of October is dedicated to the Holy Rosary, a powerful prayer entrusted to us by Our Lady. This month invites us to meditate more deeply on the mysteries of Christ through Mary’s eyes. Also, each October the Catholic Church in the United States celebrates Respect Life Month, and the first Sunday of October is designated as Respect Life Sunday. Perhaps as a family we can pray the rosary together with the special intention that through Mary perhaps we might restore a greater respect for all Life. May Our Lady of the Rosary, pray for us.

One of the concerns that I have had for quite a while is the security for our young people and older ones who attend our Masses, be it on the weekend or during the weekday. Unfortunately, we live in a world filled with a lack of respect for life. And so, as a response, I hope to form a committee to help us deal with this concern. Anyone that would like to volunteer time and talents toward this committee, please call me and leave your name and number here at the rectory. I want to make our Church as secure as possible but cannot do it alone.


