Solemnity of All Souls

NOVEMBER 2, 2025

(There are many optional readings which are taken from Masses for the Dead.)

Today we remember that it is a good and holy thought to pray for the dead. The Scriptures tell us that nothing defiled will enter heaven (Revelation 12:7). The Scriptures also tell us that all have sinned and are unworthy of the glory of God.

If this is true, we are in a sorry state. Christ has redeemed all persons of all times and places. He has superabundantly paid the debt of all sin. But he wills that we should share in his mission of redemption and satisfaction.

Every sin, including venial sin, deserves punishment. We must do penance in union with Christ for every sin. If we do not do penance in this life, we shall surely do it in the life to come, in purgatory. Purgatory is not found in the Bible. But, then, many other things which Christians take for granted are not found in the Bible.

The New Testament did not exist as one volume until the latter part of the Second Century. But the Church was teaching during all those years. About the same time that the New Testament books were being gathered into one volume and canonized by the Church, we have witnesses to the Church's belief in prayer for the dead and in purgatory.

Tertullian writes about Purgatory around the year 207 A.D. Inscriptions on the catacombs of Rome and elsewhere in the Roman empire testify to belief in prayer for the dead. Purgatory is a merciful doctrine: Otherwise, those who had committed slight sins would be forever excluded from heaven.

The souls in purgatory cannot benefit themselves, but we can benefit them by our prayers. We should pray for the dead each day. And we should be sobered by the thought that we must do penance for every sin we ever commit. It is easier to do it in this life than in the next.

The Commemoration Of All The Faithful Departed, November 2, 2025

Dear Parishioners,

When we recite the “apostle’s creed,” we profess a faith that believes in what is called the “Communion of Saints.” When I was a young boy in grade school, I still remember the Baltimore Catechism describing the “communion of saints” as threefold. It used to call this profession a belief in the Church militant, the Church triumphant, and the Church suffering. According to this catechism, the Church as we know it is much broader in scope than just you and me. The Church militant were all those members of the Church who are still struggling with temptation and sin, fighting our best as soldiers for Christ to overcome the evil, thus the militant. With God’s grace and mercy, we maintain the fight against sin and evil in all its forms and with God’s help try to live His gospel. Thus the Church militants are you and me. But there is what the catechism calls the Church triumphant. This group of people have died after having fought the good fight, and as St. Paul says, kept the faith, and now await the crown of righteousness. These are the people we firmly believe are enjoying the fruits of labor in their lives. These are the people who are living with the risen Lord in the joys of heaven. These people consist of those canonized as saints and those who are not but still live in the presence of their God and ours in heaven. We celebrate this Church triumphant on November 1, the solemnity of All Saints. Finally, we also remember, as the Baltimore catechism calls them, the Church suffering. These are the members of the Church who have gone before us in death but because of their flaws, weaknesses, and tendencies need further purification in order to prepare them for the eternal joys of heaven. In short, we call this Church, the souls in purgatory, or the Church suffering. We remember them on November 2, the commemoration of the faithful departed. As a young server, I remember celebrating three Masses that day with a priest. It was one of two days in the year, with Christmas being the other, that a priest could offer and celebrate three Masses. Thus we have the Communion of Saints, a profession of faith that provides us hope for the crown of glory that awaits us in heaven. And so, as we pray today for those who have died, let this traditional prayer be ours as we say “eternal rest grant unto them O Lord and let perpetual light shine upon them. May they rest in peace. May their souls and the souls of all the faithful departed rest in peace. Amen.”




