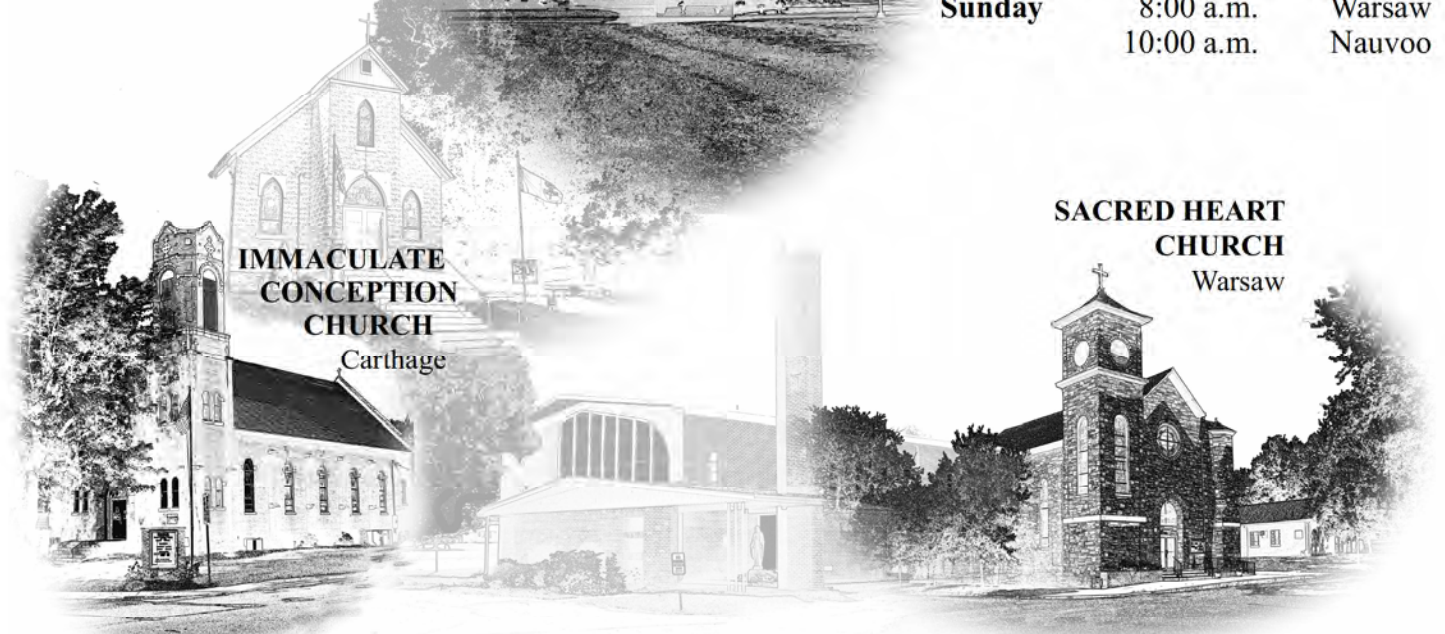

Vehicles parked all over the place...and a seemingly endless line of vehicles as far as you could see down Young Street...What an amazing day for our SPPS Annual Fall Dinner! Both sit down and carry out features of the day were well attended. And the support for Sts. Peter and Paul School was overwhelming. Thanks to the cooks, all the helpers, and to everyone who was a part of a power-packed two hours last Sunday!

Looking Ahead: Advent, and Primary/Secondary Church Site Considerations. Next weekend is the Solemnity of Christ the King, the end of the Church's Liturgical Year of Worship. Advent begins on Sunday, November 30. And beyond November 30, into the coming year 2026, we begin what we could call a "fine tuning" of our Parish's use of our three church sites. Here are a few notes, coming your way:

We will not have an expanded Mass schedule for the season of Advent. We will have expanded opportunities for Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and the Sacrament of Penance throughout the Advent season. *Please consider renewing your spiritual life in preparation for Christmas (and beyond) through the offering of a sincere confession of sins and time in the presence of our Eucharistic Lord in Blessed Sacrament.*

Masses for this Christmas: SPPN, 4 p.m.; ICC, 7 p.m.; SHW, 10 p.m. on Christmas Eve. 8 a.m. on Christmas Day at SPPN only.

In 2026, each church site will have one Mass for Christmas Eve/Christmas Day. This will be the beginning of a permanent schedule into the future. Scheduling begins with SPPN, because it is designated as the primary church site.

For many years, we've known that our situation is unique, and doesn't quite "fit the mold" of primary and secondary church site privileges. Nevertheless, we have to honor, as much as possible, what these designations mean: primary church site means primary consideration when it comes to schedule; secondary church site means a schedule in relation to the schedule of the primary church site. Thank you for your patience throughout the past three years, and 2026, coming right up.

Healing Service, with the healing ministry of Mr. Roger Shaner, the Sacraments of Penance and The Anointing of the Sick, and intercessory prayer to Bishop Fulton Sheen, will take place on **Saturday, November 15, at IC Church Site, after the 4:00 p.m. Mass.**

Prayer with SPPS: You're Invited! On Friday, November 21, after the 8:30 a.m. Mass with the SPPS students, we will have a procession from the church to the SPPS Gym, which will be set up for prayer before the Blessed Sacrament, as well as opportunity for confession, the Sacrament of Penance. The children will come into the gym in "shifts," classroom by classroom, for prayer and opportunity for confession for the Catholic students. The gym will be a very quiet house of prayer. And for parents, grandparents, and parishioners of our parish from all church sites: you're invited to come and be with the kids - be with your children and grandchildren - to be a part of the quiet and peace of this prayer time. Non-Catholics: a part of the gym will be arranged so that you can be a part of this event without any compromise of the practice of your faith. Times such as these can have a tremendous effect on us; you might find something very fulfilling here. We hope to see you Friday, November 21!
