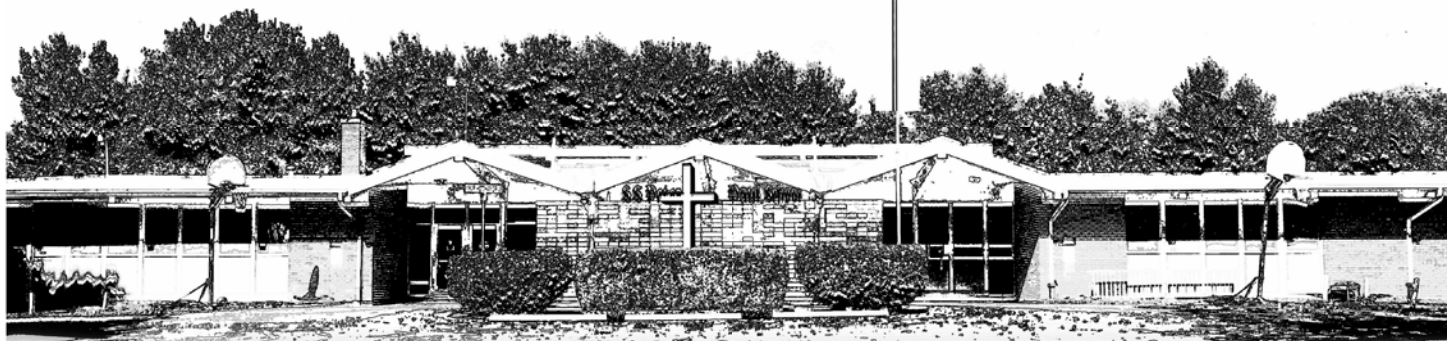

The Season of Advent

"When the Church celebrates the liturgy of Advent each year, she makes present the ancient expectancy of the Messiah, for by sharing in the long preparation for the Savior's first coming, the faithful renew their ardent desire for his second coming." (Catechism, paragraph 524).

"The coming of God's Son to earth is an event of such immensity that God willed to prepare for it over centuries. He makes everything converge on Christ: all the rituals and sacrifices, figures and symbols of the First Covenant. He announces Him (Jesus) through the mouths of the prophets who succeeded one another in Israel. Moreover, he awakens in the hearts of the pagans a dim expectation of this coming." (Catechism, paragraph 522).

"Interior repentance is a radical reorientation of our whole life, a return, a conversion to God with all our heart, an end of sin, a turning away from evil, with repugnance toward the evil actions we have committed. At the same time, it entails the desire and resolution to change one's life, with hope in God's mercy and trust in the help of his grace. This conversion of heart is accompanied by a salutary pain and sadness which the Fathers called affliction of spirit and repentance of heart." (Catechism, paragraph 1431).

St. Nicholas Day, December 6. Let's see....a Bishop who was known for taking care of his people...every bit as staunch a defender and promoter of Catholic faith as St. Patrick, St. Augustine of Canterbury, St. Boniface, and St. Denis...vigorous opponent of the heresy of Arianism...miracle worker...*and helper of those in need, at nighttime when nobody could see or recognize him - except somebody must have found out, or you wouldn't be reading this!* Now who does this remind you of?...Let's get ready for him at Christmas, too, kids.
