First Sunday of Advent

NOVEMBER 30, 2025

Isaiah 2:1-5; Romans 3:11-14;
Matthew 24:37-44

During this year, our Gospel will usually be taken from Matthew. Today our Scripture readings are: Isaiah 2: 1-5; Romans 13:11-14; and Matthew 24:37-44.

Isaiah hoped for justice, joy, and peace. He longed for the day when mankind would make plows out of their swords, and vine-trimmers out of their spears. He longed for the day when all people would be united in respect for each other and in the love of the Lord. But Isaiah did not see that day; neither have we.

St. Paul, in the second reading, says that our salvation is nearer now than when we first believed. The time of justice, joy, and peace is nearer. Perfect justice and peace must await the Second (Glorious) Coming of the Lord. Meanwhile, however, it is “closer,” because we become a holier people, a more loving people, a people who seek to radiate hope for justice and peace.

The Gospel selection is very similar to that of two Sundays ago. It speaks of the sudden coming of the Day of the Lord. This glorious Second Coming of Christ is often called the “Parousia” (pah-roo-SEE-uh.)

We don’t know when the Lord will come; but we must always be prepared. We prepare by living each day as best we can. Each day, we try to become the person God wants us to be. Each day we try to spread the light of the Lord by our lives.

Let us be an Advent people, a people of hope and joy. We must live in an imperfect world, but we must seek to make it perfect. We do this by showing what Christ means in our lives.

First Sunday of Advent, November 30, 2025

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend we are entering into the season of the Church that we call Advent. According to our ordo, “Advent has a two-fold character, for it is a time of preparation for the Solemnities of Christmas, in which the first Coming of the Son of God to humanity is remembered, and likewise a time when, by remembrance of this, minds and hearts are led to look forward to Christ’s Second Coming, at the end of time. For these two reasons, Advent is a period of devout and expectant delight. With the ushering in this Advent season, the new Year of the Church for 2026 begins. What this means is that we will be following the cycle of Readings in the Year A on Sundays and the cycle of Readings II during the weekday cycle. Happy Advent to all.

One of the popular symbols in our Church and home as we celebrate Advent is the Advent wreath. This wreath, consisting of four candles (three violet or purple and one rose) are then lit during the weekends of Advent, signifying each weekend as we get closer to the fullness of light that comes to us at the Coming of Christ as Christmas. There is a blessing in our missalette to be used when we use this symbol in our homes. It is the following:

Christ came to bring us salvation and has promised to come again. Let us pray that we may be always ready to welcome Him.

1. *That the keeping of Advent may open our hearts to God’s love, we pray to the Lord.*
2. *That the light of Christ may penetrate the darkness of sin, we pray to the Lord.*
3. *That this wreath may constantly remind us to prepare for the coming of Christ, we pray to the Lord.*
4. *That the Christmas season may fill us with peace and joy as we strive to follow the example of Jesus, we pray to the Lord.*

Lord God, your Church joyfully awaits the coming of its Savior, who enlightens our hearts and dispels the darkness of ignorance and sin. Pour forth your blessings upon us as we light the candles of this wreath; may their light reflect the splendor of Christ who is Lord for ever and ever. Amen

Next Monday, December 8, is the Solemnity of Mary under the title of the Immaculate Conception. It is a Holy Day of Obligation for all Catholics. It is under this title that she is the patron of our country and our diocese. Our Mass schedule is as follows: 8:20 Mass at St. Peter; 10:00 Mass at QND; 12:10 Mass at St. Peter and 6:00 p.m. Mass at St. Peter. There will be NO Vigil Mass on Sunday evening since the Second Sunday of Advent takes precedence over the Solemnity. But our Catholic Spiritual life must include an important place for Mary. She is not a goddess; she is not our access to Jesus; she is not the source of every grace and blessing. But she is the Mother of God and the Mother of the Church. She is, in the word of William Wordsworth, “our tainted natures solitary boast.” She is the model of what we should be as Christians; she is the sign of what we would have been and should have been if there never had been Original Sin. Our Lady of the Immaculate Conception, pray for us now and forever.






