# Pastor's Letter

November 30, 2025—1st Sunday of Advent

Dear Church Family,

“For our salvation is nearer now than when we first believed.” Romans 13:11

One of the blessings of being a Christian is knowing that history is going somewhere. Many people today suffer from a lack of meaning in their lives. They think that human beings are just a product of random chance, an accidental collision of chemicals that evolved over billions of years resulting in you and me. The universe has no purpose or goal or direction. It's pretty hard to have hope for the future when you don't believe there is any point to your existence.

The Christian faith teaches that our lives do have a point. We are here for a reason: to love and serve God and enjoy life in his presence forever. Every day is an opportunity to grow in love and move closer to the fulfillment of that purpose. The story of the universe is a love story. It begins with our creation in the outpouring of God's love. It develops as God invites us to return his love and expand the circle of his love by sharing it with others. It comes to completion at the end of time when all things will be made new and love will triumph over all, even death.

But, as Shakespeare said, the course of true love never did run smooth. There is drama in this love story because this is a real love story, and we have a say in how it all turns out. Will we accept God's love? Will we embrace the purpose for which we were made? Or will we part ways with our Creator and leave behind the source of meaning for our lives?

Last Sunday we read in St. Paul's letter to the Colossians, “(Christ) is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation. For in him were created all things in heaven and on earth, the visible and the invisible, whether thrones or dominions or principalities or powers; all things were created through him and for him. He is before all things, and in him all things hold together.” (Col. 1:15-17) Everything comes from him and everything is moving back to him. Love is our origin and love is our endpoint. May love be the driving force that gives meaning to our lives and brings us home.

During Advent we remember Jesus' first coming, and get ourselves and our homes ready to celebrate His birthday. Lighting the candles on an Advent wreath helps us to remember that Jesus, the light of the world, is coming. We start with one candle, and every week light one more, so that the closer we get to Jesus' coming the brighter it gets.




In Advent we also think about Jesus' second coming. In today's Gospel reading Jesus tells the people to be prepared for that time. We must never let ourselves forget that this world and this life are only temporary and that we have something much greater to look forward to: Jesus and Heaven!
