Dedication of the Lateran Basilica

NOVEMBER 9, 2025

Ezekiel 47:1-2,8-9,12;
1 Corinthians 3:9c-11,16-17; John 2:13-22

The center of our life in Christ is the church building. It is nothing but stone or brick or wood, but it is the place where we encounter the Lord in his sacraments. We are born into Christ's Body there; we are nourished with his Body and Blood there; we offer perfect praise to our Father through Jesus Christ there; we are cleansed of our sins there; we are married there or ordained there; and our bodies are brought there after our death to be honored and then to be buried to await the resurrection.

"St. John Lateran" is a misnomer. The real name of this church is the "Cathedral of the Most Holy Savior." It is the pope's Cathedral in Rome. When the Emperor Constantine gave the Church freedom in the Fourth Century, he gave the pope the property which had belonged to the Laterani family. The popes lived in the Lateran palace for a thousand years. Next door we built the Cathedral. It became the baptismal Church of ancient Rome. Though Rome had many churches, everyone was baptized here. The magnificent baptistry (larger than most churches in the United States) was dedicated to St. John the Baptist. Thus many people began calling the Church after the family and after the baptistry: Thus the misnomer "St. John Lateran!"

Our first reading is a vision of water flowing from the temple: first a trickle, then a stream, then a torrent and a flood. The reading is intended to recall baptism with its life-giving waters. We become the Church through baptism, and we bear abundant fruit.

The second reading tells us that we are God's temple! We honor buildings, but we should remember that building will pass away. But we, the Church, the Body of Christ, are that living temple of Christ. Christ truly dwells in us and among us. The motive for every virtue, and especially for the virtue of purity, should be that we always want to honor our bodies as temples of God.

The gospel is Jesus' cleansing of the temple. Good Jews realized that there were problems of merchandising in the temple. They also knew that the high priestly family during Jesus' time was corrupt. Some thought that the Messiah would cleanse the existing temple; others thought it would be destroyed and a new temple would come from heaven. (This is the view of the Book of Revelation.) Jesus speaks of the temple of his Body: He will rise from the dead after three days. And from his death and resurrection will come the new temple, the Church.

The Dedication of the Lateran Basilica Feast, November 9, 2025

Dear Parishioners,

Today in our Church calendar we take a break once again from “ordinary time” as we celebrate the Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica. This particular Feast is unusual in the Church’s calendar because it is a feast for a building rather than a saint or an event in salvation history. The Basilica of St. John—dedicated to St. John the Baptist and St. John the Evangelist—is the cathedral of Rome, the mother church of the mother diocese of the world. Most people think St. Peter’s Basilica in the Vatican is the cathedral of Rome, but it is not. St. John Church, located on the Lateran Hill (thus the name St. John Lateran) holds the cathedral or “throne” of the bishop of Rome, the chair of Peter. A new pope is not fully installed until he takes possession of St. John Lateran and sits in the cathedral of Rome. In 2000, when I celebrated my 25 years as a priest, I had the privilege of visiting Rome and touring the many sites. One of my goals was to visit the Four major Basilicas in Rome—namely, St. Peter, St John Lateran, St. Mary Major, and St. Paul outside of Rome. I made it to three of the four but because of a language barrier, I never made it to St. Paul outside of Rome. The cab drive, well intentioned, took me some place but it wasn’t St. Paul’s. But when I toured these major basilicas, one of the things that I noticed was what was engraved above the entrance to St. John Lateran. It read the following: “Omnium ecclesiarum Urbis et Orbis mater et caput.” Translated it announced, “mother and head of all churches of Rome and the world.”

As the Church celebrates this particular feast, we also recognize that just as these Churches in Rome are significant to our history, so is our own Church of St. Peter. It is here where we gather each week to celebrate the Presence of the Lord in our midst through His Word and His Sacraments. It is here that we proclaim our catholicity, the universal Church that was founded upon Peter and the apostles and still is the very source of our unity with each other and with our God. And so when we celebrate the Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica, we are proclaiming our communion with the Bishop of Rome. St. Ambrose once said, where Peter is, there is the Church. If we are in communion with the bishop of Rome, we are in communion with Christ’s Church. Practically speaking, this also means being united to our local bishops. Today we celebrate our unity in Christ as the universal Church.

I ask for your prayers next week as I visit the Siteman Cancer Center at Barnes Hospital for further evaluation. Hopefully, I’ll have some direction as to future treatments.

This week we continue our annual stewardship renewal. Each of you will be receiving via the mail the renewal information and I ask you to look it over and take the invitation to prayer, asking our Lord to help you be the good stewards of what He has given to you. This weekend we will be hearing from Zach and Katelyn Kinscherf. In the meantime, please look over the information provided, always asking yourself what more can I do or give, but always recognizing how God has blessed you with His gift of time, the talents received, and the treasures gained. As the renewal reminds us, we are Pilgrims of Hope, ever thankful to God for His gifts and generous to return a rightful portion to Him and His Church.
