## *Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph*

DECEMBER 28, 2025

Sirach 3:2-6,12-14; Colossians 3:12-21;  
Matthew 2:13-15,19-23

Even politicians pay lip service to “family values.” But family life will be renewed *only* if it is centered in Jesus Christ with the Holy Family as its model.

Each member of the family has an important and unique place. Fathers must be like Joseph – strong, upright, good providers, and protectors of the family. They must be patient and understanding with their children, and loving and caring for their wives.

Mothers must be the heart and spirit of the home. Like Mary, they must reflect on all things in their heart. Their response must always be Mary’s: Whatever God wants, they want. They must be the tender, gentle, healers in the family.

Children must respect and obey their parents. They must be grateful for the sacrifices of their parents. Each member of the family is called to sacrifice his/her own needs for the good of the family. That is the meaning of real love.

Children who honor parents are honored by the Lord; parents who sacrifice for children are rewarded by loving children. The second reading gives virtues necessary for every good family: kindness, humility, meekness, patience, and forgiveness. Let us pray that our families will be holy families in the Lord.

## 4TH SUNDAY OF ADVENT

This fourth and final week in Advent is a beautiful foretaste of what we are about to celebrate. We hear from Isaiah again about how God Himself will come to be with His people. A virgin will bear a son named Emmanuel, which means God is with us. There is a beautiful song my family used to listen to during the Advent and Christmas seasons. Amy Grant was our Christmas favorite to listen to. She has a song called "Love Has Come." It is an upbeat song about "when the God of glory who is full of mercy sent His Son." The lines that always get me is when she sings, "If I could have a special dream coming true on Christ morn', I would want the world to see how His Father smiled when Christ was born. The greatest gift the world has known!" How powerful a thought. The Gospel is from Matthew giving us the lead-up to the birth of Christ. He tells us the background of how God reassured Joseph that all this was the fulfillment of all the prophets. We often focus so much on Mary in the story of the birth of Christ that we often miss the immensity of righteousness and trust that Joseph too had in this beautiful moment.

May we strive to be like Joseph; to just get up and do as the Lord has commanded without question or hesitation. I would want to see how Mary and Joseph smiled when Christ was born, but wow what a thought about the smile that God the Father had when Jesus was born into this world. So let us prepare our hearts to receive the greatest gift the world has known, the baby Jesus.

Your generosity helps to make that happen. Thank you for your kindness and care. If you are traveling for Christmas, please drive safely and know of my prayers for your safe arrival there and back. 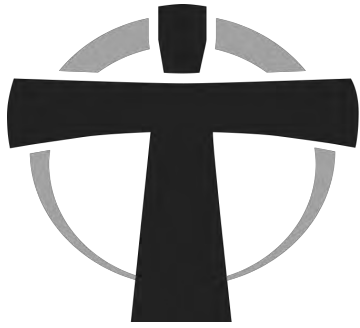
### **QND Cheer Camp**
