Each member of the family has an important and unique place. Fathers must be like Joseph – strong, upright, good providers, and protectors of the family. They must be patient and understanding with their children, and loving and caring for their wives.

Mothers must be the heart and spirit of the home. Like Mary, they must reflect on all things in their heart. Their response must always be Mary’s: Whatever God wants, they want. They must be the tender, gentle, healers in the family.

Children must respect and obey their parents. They must be grateful for the sacrifices of their parents. Each member of the family is called to sacrifice his/her own needs for the good of the family. That is the meaning of real love.

Children who honor parents are honored by the Lord; parents who sacrifice for children are rewarded by loving children. The second reading gives virtues necessary for every good family: kindness, humility, meekness, patience, and forgiveness. Let us pray that our families will be holy families in the Lord.

Dear Parishioners,

We gather this weekend to celebrate our fourth and final Sunday in our season of Advent. Our celebration seems to be the bridge between the anticipation of Christ's coming and the actual coming in history. So our gospel begins, *"this is how the birth of Jesus Christ came about. When His mother Mary was betrothed to Joseph, but before they lived together, she was found with child through the Holy Spirit. Joseph, her husband, since he was a righteous man, yet unwilling to expose her to shame, decided to divorce her quietly. Such was his intention when, behold, the angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, 'Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary your wife into your home. For it is through the Holy Spirit that this child has been conceived in her. She will bear a son and you are to name Him Jesus, because He will save His people from their sins.'* When Joseph awoke, he did as the angel of the Lord had commanded him and took his wife into his home." Thus we have the beginning of the Good News of our Salvation. God has entered our world to save us from ourselves, and thus reveal to us His Father's love. May that love that became a human person draw us ever closer to His Kingdom and may each of us become a mirror of that love for others. That's the greatest Christmas gift we could give to each other.

This Sunday, December 21, we will have our annual city-wide Advent Penance Service to be held at St. Francis beginning at 2:00 p.m. There will be a number of priests from the area who will be present for individual confessions. I encourage you to attend and celebrate this Sacrament with us and thus make "ready the way of the Lord in each of your lives." This will be the last time that individual confessions will be available so please use this time wisely and receive the forgiveness of the Lord and His reconciliation in your life.

On behalf of the parish and school administration, I want to wish each and every one of you a very Blessed and Merry Christmas. Our celebration of Christmas will be as follows:

Wednesday, Christmas Eve: Masses will be at 4:00, 6:00, and 8:00 p.m.

Thursday, Christmas Day: Masses will be at 8:00 and 10:00 a.m.

For those thinking about attending the 4:00 Mass on Christmas Eve, I want you to know that this is a standing room only Mass as it is very crowded. Since there is No reserved seating, people in attendance must get in Church by 3:30 in order to secure a seat.

As we bless our Christmas crib, let us pray the following: *"God of every nation and people, from the very beginning of creation you have made manifest your love; when our need for a Savior was great you sent your Son to be born of the Virgin Mary. To our lives He brings joy and peace, justice, mercy, and love.*

Lord, bless all who look upon this manger; may it remind us of the humble birth of Jesus, and raise up our thoughts to Him, who is God with us and Savior of all, and who lives and reigns forever and ever. Amen.




