Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph

Sirach 3:2-6,12-14; Colossians 3:12-21;
Matthew 2:13-15,19-23

Even politicians pay lip service to “family values.” But family life will be renewed *only* if it is centered in Jesus Christ with the Holy Family as its model.

Each member of the family has an important and unique place. Fathers must be like Joseph – strong, upright, good providers, and protectors of the family. They must be patient and understanding with their children, and loving and caring for their wives.

Mothers must be the heart and spirit of the home. Like Mary, they must reflect on all things in their heart. Their response must always be Mary’s: Whatever God wants, they want. They must be the tender, gentle, healers in the family.

Children must respect and obey their parents. They must be grateful for the sacrifices of their parents. Each member of the family is called to sacrifice his/her own needs for the good of the family. That is the meaning of real love.

Children who honor parents are honored by the Lord; parents who sacrifice for children are rewarded by loving children. The second reading gives virtues necessary for every good family: kindness, humility, meekness, patience, and forgiveness. Let us pray that our families will be holy families in the Lord.

The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph Feast, December 28, 2025

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend after Christmas, we gather to celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. This feast celebrates the fact that Jesus came into the world within the context of a family, and that family would mold and fashion this Son of God into the man of faith, hope, and love that He would become. This family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph offer our families an example of what it means to live in holiness and faith. The first thing we notice is that this holy family knew its own share of heartache, challenge, and hardship. As we hear in our gospel today that they were forced to travel far from home during the riskiest time of Mary's pregnancy, leading to their Son's birth in a rough place and in conditions less than ideal. Shortly after the birth, they are told that they must flee for their lives and the life of their newborn Son. They travel in haste to a distant land until they receive the message that it is safe for them to return. Their challenges resemble the challenges we experience in our own families.

This Feast of the Holy Family holds up for us their example of simple trust and openness to God, and the faith which they shared. They show us that our families, even in times of challenge or uncertainty, can also be holy families—settings in each of us can grow in kindness, humility, gentleness and peace.

On this Feast of the Holy Family, I want to let you know that each of you will be remembered in my prayers. As I reflect upon my parish family, I realize the holiness that exists in each of your lives. May that holiness continue to permeate your lives as you share it with others. On this feast of the Holy Family, this is my prayer for you:

“We bless your name, O Lord, for sending your own Incarnate Son to become part of a family, so that, as He lived its life, He would experience its worries and its joys.

We ask you, Lord, to protect and watch over this family, so that in the strength of your grace its members may enjoy prosperity, possess the priceless gift of your peace, and, as the Church alive in the home, bear witness in this world to your glory.

May the Lord Jesus, who lived with His holy family in Nazareth, dwell also with your family, keep it from all evil, and make all of you one in heart and mind. Amen.

As usual, our Church was beautifully decorated for Christmas on the outside as well as the inside. I am so proud of people who know how to decorate in a simple but glorious fashion. Our decorations are so welcoming and display the mystery of Christmas in such a simple but glorious way. Thank you for making our Christmas celebration a liturgy of class and beauty.

I also want to thank our choirs for enhancing our liturgies with their gift of song. Through your participation, you put each of us in the spirit of Christmas. Thank you for sharing your gifts with all of us.

Again, to each and every one of you, I want to wish you a very Blessed and Merry Christmas.

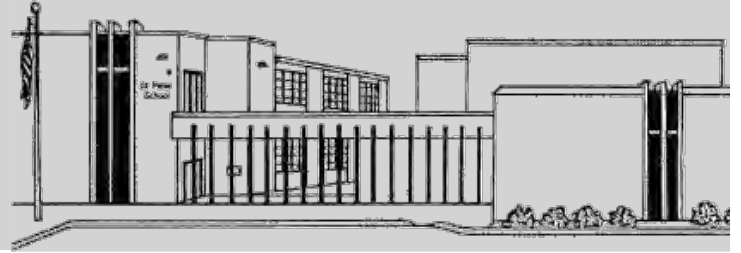




