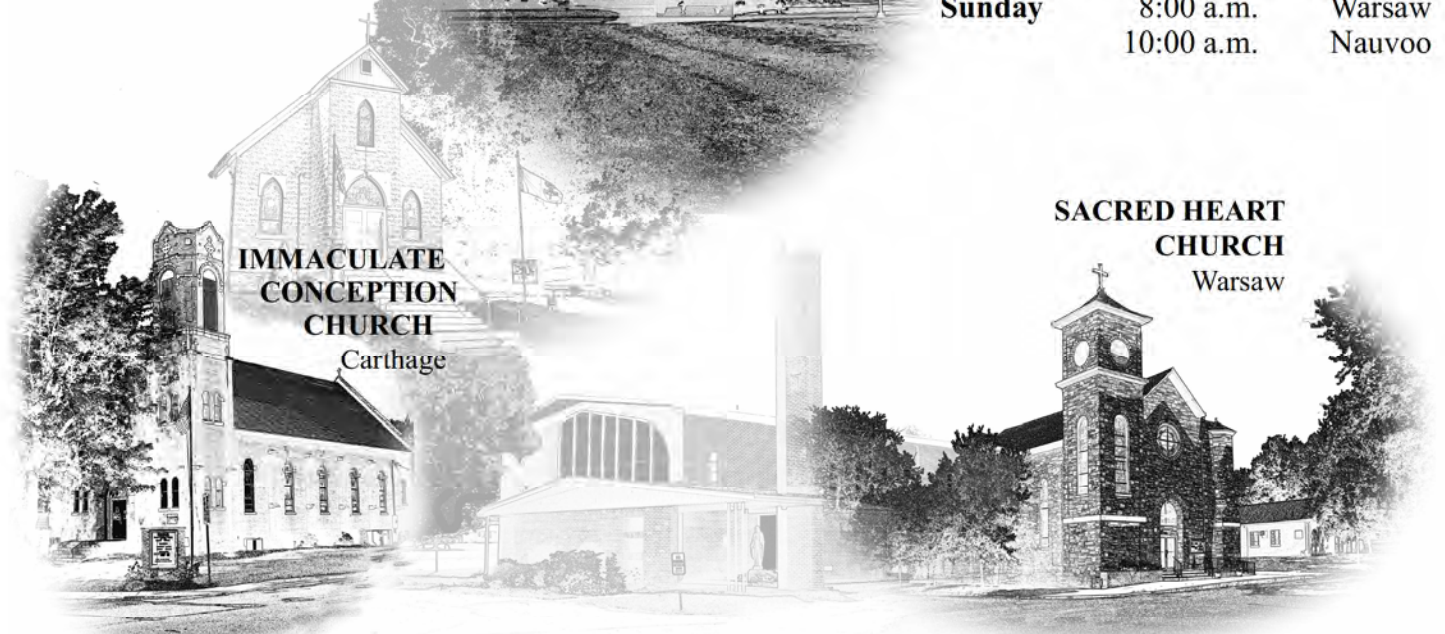

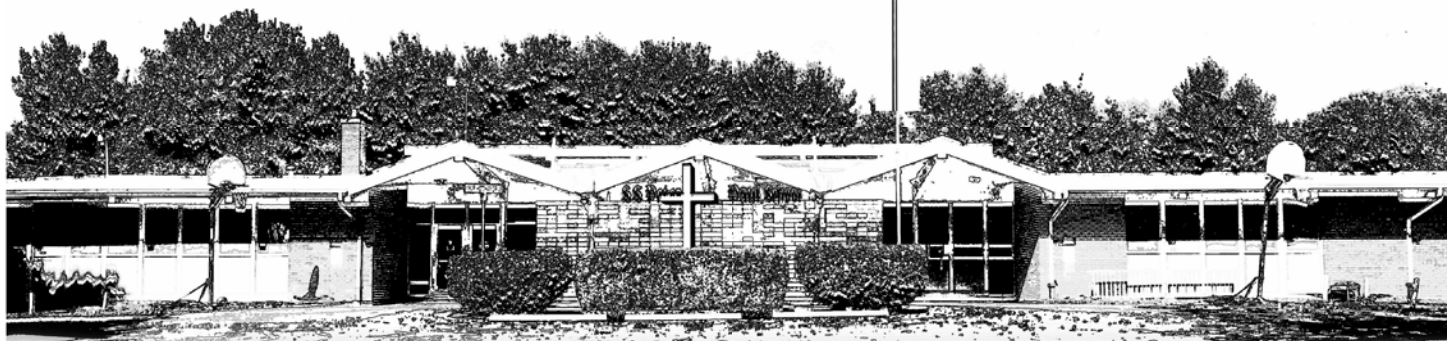

Christian Unity Week Begins January 18; Pro Life Anniversary January 23.

The decision to overturn the Roe v. Wade Supreme Court decision was only the beginning; action at the state level on its own won't be enough. *People's hearts have to be converted.* We have to learn that, as a natural symbol, abortion encompasses all human life, *because all human life is contained in each human life.* The environmentalists are right: we are all connected; not just animals and natural resources, to us - *but each of us, to each other, and in each other.* This is why the affronts to human life spread, no matter the good will or good intentions of people and the dire situations in which they find themselves. Evidence: the awful decision to give assisted suicide sanction of law in our state. Tiers of medication due to insurance ramifications; a culture that "lowers the bar" on the value of human life: medical professionals judging whether patients should be allowed to live *without family consultation* (already happened in Europe): a future where someone decides for you whether you should live, by criteria upon which you were not consulted....Please try to understand the teaching of the Catholic Church. No limit or obstacle is overcome by backing away from it; but only by standing firm against the limit or obstacle until it can be overcome. That goes for the mystery of suffering, and the ordinary means to address it. Basic, foundational Catholic teaching: the sanctity of human life. Fr. T.

About Christian Unity...Did You Know?....

Do you know the difference between: unity the way the Catholic Church sees it, and; unity the way our respected and loved Christian communities of various traditions and other world religions see it? The latter value unity as something we all share in common, to the extent that there is agreement among all of us, with a view toward striving for unity not yet attained. To them, the Catholic Church is one among many denominations. The Catholic Church teaches that unity is something *we already have*; unity with other ecclesial communities and world religions is a matter of entering into that unity already possessed. Ready for further complication?!! *Even the Catholic Church has to enter more deeply, more fully into her own unity.* That's our "take" on all of us striving for unity. If we're at odds (respectfully...come on, it's the 21st century) over what unity means, "kind of" makes sense to start with the meeting of the minds there, doesn't it? Families everywhere are affected - and sometimes enriched - by this matter. Let's remember the words from the First Letter of Peter: "Always be prepared to make a defense to anyone who calls you to account for the hope that is in you, *yet do it with gentleness and reverence....*" (1 Peter 3:15...from the first Pope...Oops! Let's take on one thing at a time!) Fr. T.
