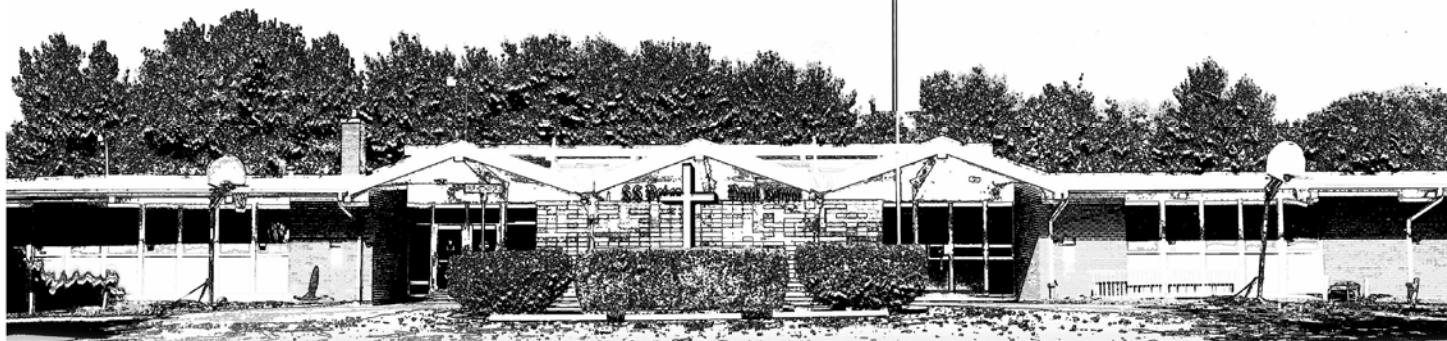

On the Occasion of This Year's Catholic Schools Week.

In the teaching of the Catholic Church, the "form" of any given person or thing is its essence, and the goal into which its essence is to be transformed. Therefore, the soul is the form of the body, and union with Jesus Christ is the form of the soul - in Catholic faith, actualized through her sacraments. We also teach that the soul is not contained in the body, but the body is contained in the soul *as encased in the body*. This means that, in this life, soul and body are totally, comprehensively united to each other in such a way as to be inseparable: the human being is one, body and soul. Whatever is done to either one, or by either one, is done to both, by both, as one.

Now, you can study the volumes of experience, thought and prayer which generate summaries such as that which you have just read. *Or you can save yourself the time and the trouble and instead come and visit Sts. Peter and Paul School.* Here, form bringing the body to serve the soul, and the soul to serve union with Jesus Christ, is the everyday project, lived and taught. Here, academic performance, spiritual growth, and strength of character aren't three different things: study, worship of Jesus Christ, and formation in virtue, play, and friendship lead to a respect and a treasuring of the unity and the dignity of each student. It's all one thing!

A Look Ahead to the Season of Lent. Over many years here, I found it ironic that we would provide Friday evening Masses during the season of Lent, only to have people head straight for the Fish Fry without taking advantage of the opportunity to pray the Stations of the Cross and go to Mass. So, we're going to return to a Friday evening Lenten practice from previous generations in the life of our Church. Instead of Mass, there will be Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, the Scriptural Stations of the Cross, and Benediction on the Friday evenings of Lent. This change also anticipates a future in which Masses will not be as available and flexibly scheduled as they used to be. And don't forget about our Liturgies of the Word, with Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and opportunity for Confession, to be scheduled throughout the season of Lent, as we did during Advent.
