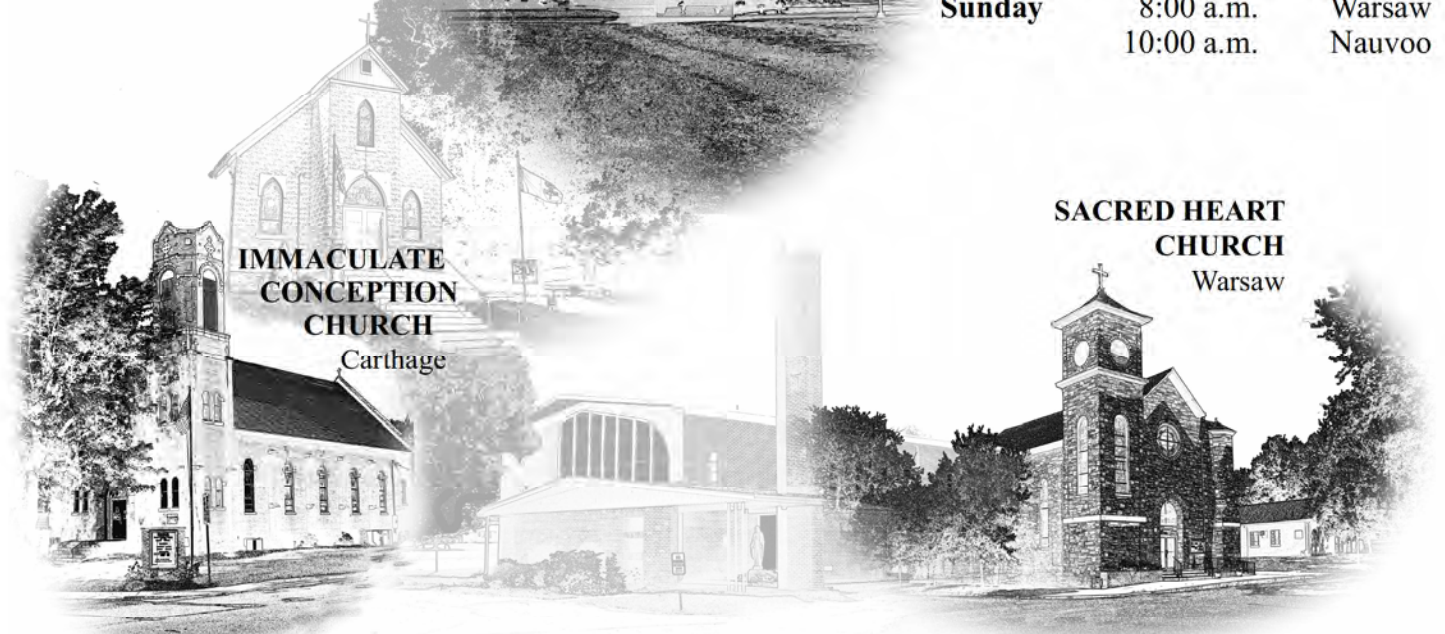

The Epiphany of the Lord

"The Epiphany is the manifestation of Jesus as Messiah of Israel, Son of God, and Savior of the world. The great feast of Epiphany celebrates the adoration of Jesus by the wise men (magi) from the East, together with his baptism and the wedding feast of Cana in Galilee. In the magi, representatives of the neighboring pagan religions, the Gospel sees the first fruits of the nations, who welcome the Good News of salvation through the Incarnation. The magi's coming to Jerusalem in order to pay homage to the king of the Jews shows that they seek in Israel, in the messianic light of the star of David, the one who will be king of the nations. Their coming means that pagans can discover Jesus and worship him as Son of God and Savior of the world only by turning towards the Jews and receiving from them the messianic promise as contained in the Old Testament. The Epiphany shows that 'the full number of the nations now takes its place in the family of the patriarchs,' and is made worthy of the heritage of Israel." (from *The Catechism of the Catholic Church*, paragraph 528.)

Spanish Mass will take place on Sunday, January 11, 5:00 p.m., at Immaculate Conception Church Carthage. The homily is printed and will be available in English and in Spanish. We have missalettes in the format of the old Missals: Spanish and English, side by side, page by page, so that English speaking parishioners and visitors can participate in the Mass, the way we used to back in the day! And we need openness to ease, familiarity, and friendships. That's how the language barrier is overcome: by ease, familiarity, and friendships. Come on over and give this new dimension of our parish realignment a chance.

Youth Group will meet on Sunday, January 11, from 7 to 8 p.m., at the Immaculate Conception Church Hall, Carthage. Fr. Tony offers deepest regrets and apologies. That tumble down from the back yard of the Villa Marie Rectory threw everything off...well, the weather didn't help either! A revised schedule for 2026 is on the way. Hope to see you on January 11!

Healing Service, featuring the Sacraments of the Anointing of the Sick and Penance, the ministry of Mr. Roger Shaner, and intercessory prayer to Bishop Fulton Sheen for the sake of miraculous healing and the advancement of his cause for sainthood, will take place on Saturday, January 17, after the 4 p.m. Mass at Carthage. (We ask for patience in the time between the end of Mass and the beginning of the Healing Service. Please allow for the exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and introductory prayer before beginning to meet with Mr. Roger Shaner.)

Let the Children Come to Me...and Let Us Come to the Children. It's going to be a full month of January 2026 for SPPS! On Friday, January 16, after the 8:30 a.m. Mass at SPPN Church with SPPS kids present, we will have another procession in silence from the church to the school, where Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament will take place, along with Confession. If you missed this event in November, you really should make it a point to come to this one. The atmosphere of total silence; the presence of the SPPS kids at prayer, spiritual reading, or other activities they bring with them; the atmosphere of the gym transformed into a chapel; and the awareness that the Holy Spirit has come down upon the entire scene: all of this just might be a spark further igniting your own faith.
