Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord

JANUARY 4, 2026

Isaiah 60:1-6; Ephesians 3:2-3a,5-6;
Matthew 2:1-12

“Epiphany” means “Manifestation” or “Showing Forth.” Originally, it referred to the official visit of a king or emperor to his provinces. There were parades (during which courtiers threw coins to the onlookers.) There was a banquet for citizens, and a general amnesty.

The word “epiphany” was taken over by the Church for the “showing forth” of the Son of God in-the-flesh. Originally, the feast commemorated three events: the coming of the Magi, the baptism of Jesus, and the wedding feast of Cana. In each case, Jesus manifested his glory.

As time went on, the focus in many (perhaps most) countries was the Magi. These were pagan wise men who probably came from Arabia or Persia. The great irony is that the Chosen people (king and priests and sages at Jerusalem) were indifferent to the birth of Jesus, whereas these pagans traveled long and far!

In our times, the focus of Epiphany is the conversion of the world. Each of the Scripture readings tell of the longing of the Gentiles and nations for light. The first reading speaks of the non-Jewish nations who wish to walk by the light of the Lord.

The Responsorial Psalm proclaims that every nation on earth should adore the Lord. The second reading says that Gentiles (non-Jews) are called to be co-heirs with the Jews in salvation. The Gospel tells of the pagan Magi who come from afar to worship the Lord.

The challenge to us is to spread the message of the truth of Jesus Christ and his Church to the world. It must begin in our neighborhood. Who have you invited to faith last year? Who will you invite this year?

The Epiphany of the Lord Solemnity, January 4, 2026

Dear Parishioners,

This is our first bulletin for our new year, 2026. As we gather this weekend as parish family, I hope and pray that God's many blessings will be bestowed upon each of you and that all of us will experience these blessings and be filled with gratitude and thanksgiving. And so my prayer for each of you is the prayer of blessing by Moses upon the people of Israel:

MAY THE LORD BLESS YOU AND KEEP YOU!

MAY THE LORD LET HIS FACE SHINE UPON YOU AND BE GRACIOUS TO YOU!

MAY THE LORD LOOK UPON YOU KINDLY AND GIVE YOU PEACE!

This weekend we celebrate the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord. The word "epiphany" means a manifestation or a "showing" of Jesus to all nations and peoples. The first Christmas in Bethlehem showed Jesus to the people of Israel, a manifestation to them represented by the shepherds. This Epiphany manifests Jesus now to the entire world, represented by the Magi who came from afar to worship this newborn king. Perhaps the best summary of our celebration today is found in our responsorial psalm for our vigil Mass which proclaimed, "All the ends of the earth have seen the saving power of God;" or for the Mass itself, "Lord, every nation on earth will adore you." God's gift of His Son is now revealed as a gift to humanity. But as we hear in our gospel, there were some who refused this gift, who saw it as a threat to their political power, namely Herod. His irrational jealousy toward this newborn king led him with a desire to destroy this child who was a threat to him. Thankfully, the magi were smart enough to see through this irrational behavior and went back another way.

On this Solemnity of the Epiphany we remember the Magi, those characters who represented us that first Christmas. We remember Melchior, an old man with white hair and a long beard who offered gold to the Lord as to a king; we remember Gaspar, young, beardless, of ruddy hue, offered to Jesus his gift of incense, the homage due divinity; and we remember Baltasar, the man of black complexion, with a heavy beard, who offered myrrh which would prefigure the death of the Son of Man. These memories come to us through Venerable Bede who provided the colorful details. As is the custom, you are invited to take some chalk and chalk your doorway with the following: **20+C+M+B+26**. The understanding of this custom is by doing this we are requesting Christ to bless our homes, those who dwell there, and those who enter throughout the entire year. Chalk will be available this weekend to inscribe this message above your doors on the Solemnity of the Epiphany.

I know that you have experienced me bragging about the decorations of our Church as they always are simple but beautiful, as they reflect the season of Christmas. I thank our committee for their skills. But I also want to personally thank Nate Frericks and Frericks nursery for their generous donation of all of our poinsettia plants that reflect the beauty of this season. If you happen to see Nate and any of the Frericks family, please personally thank them for helping St. Peter Church to be such a beautiful place for worship.


