FEBRUARY 1, 2026

Zephaniah 2:3,3:12-13; 1 Corinthians 1:26-31;
Matthew 5:1-12a

Matthew's Gospel is the most "Jewish" of the Gospels. It is structured around five great sermons or discourses of Jesus. The reason: There were five scrolls or books of Moses; Matthew shows Jesus as the "new Moses." The first of the sermons is the Sermon on the Mount. Moses went up on the mountain to receive the Holy Torah; Jesus goes up the mountain to proclaim the "new Law."

If we add the infancy story of Jesus and the Passion-Death-Resurrection narrative to the five sermons, we have *seven* units. The perfect number to the Jews was seven! These are but a few examples of the "Jewishness" of Matthew. Matthew wants to show Jesus as the fulfillment of all the promises made to the Jews.

Today's Gospel contain the opening words of the very first sermon recorded of Jesus, the Sermon on the Mount. The Beatitudes can be considered in many different ways. They may be an entirely new "value system": Jesus blesses humility; the world blesses pride. Jesus blesses the meek; the world extols the self-assertive. Jesus blesses those who are sorry for sin ("mourn"); the world never wants to admit a mistake. Jesus blesses the clean of heart; the world cherishes the risqué, the bawdy, and the immoral.

The Beatitudes might also be considered as the process of conversion: "Poor in spirit" means those who have nothing else to rely on; they must turn to God. Unless we realize our need for God, we won't turn to him. "Sorrowing" really means those who are sorry for sin. We must realize our sinfulness and want to turn away. We must hunger and thirst for holiness in order that the Lord may fill us with his saving grace. Then, in turn, if we show mercy to others, God will show us mercy.

The first reading, from Zephaniah, urges us to seek humility and justice. The second reading tells us that we aren't too sophisticated or wise; but no matter! God chooses those who are nothing to show his own powerful grace. Realize your need of God, your need to reform; hunger for holiness. The Lord will fill you.

Dear Parishioners,

The month of January seems to have flown by. There is good news and bad news with the closing of this month. The good news is that Spring is much closer to becoming a reality for us. The bad news is that we continue to endure the uncertainty of the winter months. With the last frigid weather that brought the snowstorm, the idea of Spring around the corner is very appealing. But unfortunately we will deal with whatever Mother Nature will give us.

As we gather on this 1st day of February, the Church continues to celebrate Ordinary Time as this Sunday is the 4th Sunday in this time called "ordinary." Our second reading for our Mass today gives us much food for thought. Paul is writing to the Church at Corinth, and states, "consider your own calling, brothers and sisters." Then he reminded the Corinthians and us, "Not many of you were wise by human standards, not many were powerful, not many were of noble birth." Then he tells the Corinthians and us that in spite of our lacking in human qualities, God chose us so that everything we are and all that we do is from the grace of God in our lives. Then Paul continues, "God chose the foolish of the world to shame the wise, and God chose the weak of the world to shame the strong, and God chose the lowly and despised of the world, those who count for nothing, to reduce to nothing those who are something, so that no human being might boast before God." If we are ever to boast it is boasting in the Lord. If you look at the lives of the saints, especially that of the Blessed Mother, they were people who experienced God's saving grace in their lives, appreciated the charism given to them to live saintly lives, and were always grateful to God for filling their lives with His love and forgiveness. May each of us have the same humility and gratitude for all that God has given to us.

As you should know by now, Fr. Paul is still with his family in Kenya after suffering the death of his mother. He should be returning around February 12. Please continue to keep him in your prayers.

This weekend, we bring to conclusion our Catholic School's Week. Our Catholic School is an important part of our ministry and so I continue to ask your support of it through your prayers and generosity. I also want to publicly thank all of our teachers, their aides, our office personnel, maintenance staff, our kitchen personnel, as well as our DRE, as well as our principals, Cindy Venvertloh and Chris Reichert, as well as our parents who help us in so many ways. It takes many dedicated individuals who believe in what we do in our Catholic school to make it a ministry of our Church. Thank you, Thank you. Your sacrifices and commitment mean so much to the St. Peter Parish family.

Just a reminder that February 18 is Ash Wednesday and the beginning of our new season of Lent. At this point in time I know that we are not able to have all evening Masses during the week because of my illness and not wanting to overload Fr. Paul. What I am thinking of doing is having a Mass on each Wednesday during Lent with confessional time from 5:30-6:15 and Mass beginning at 6:30 p.m. Then on Friday, we will have the same confessional times, but then, instead of Mass, have the devotion of the Stations of the Cross and Benediction. It will be different from years before but we just don't have the vocations to do everything.




