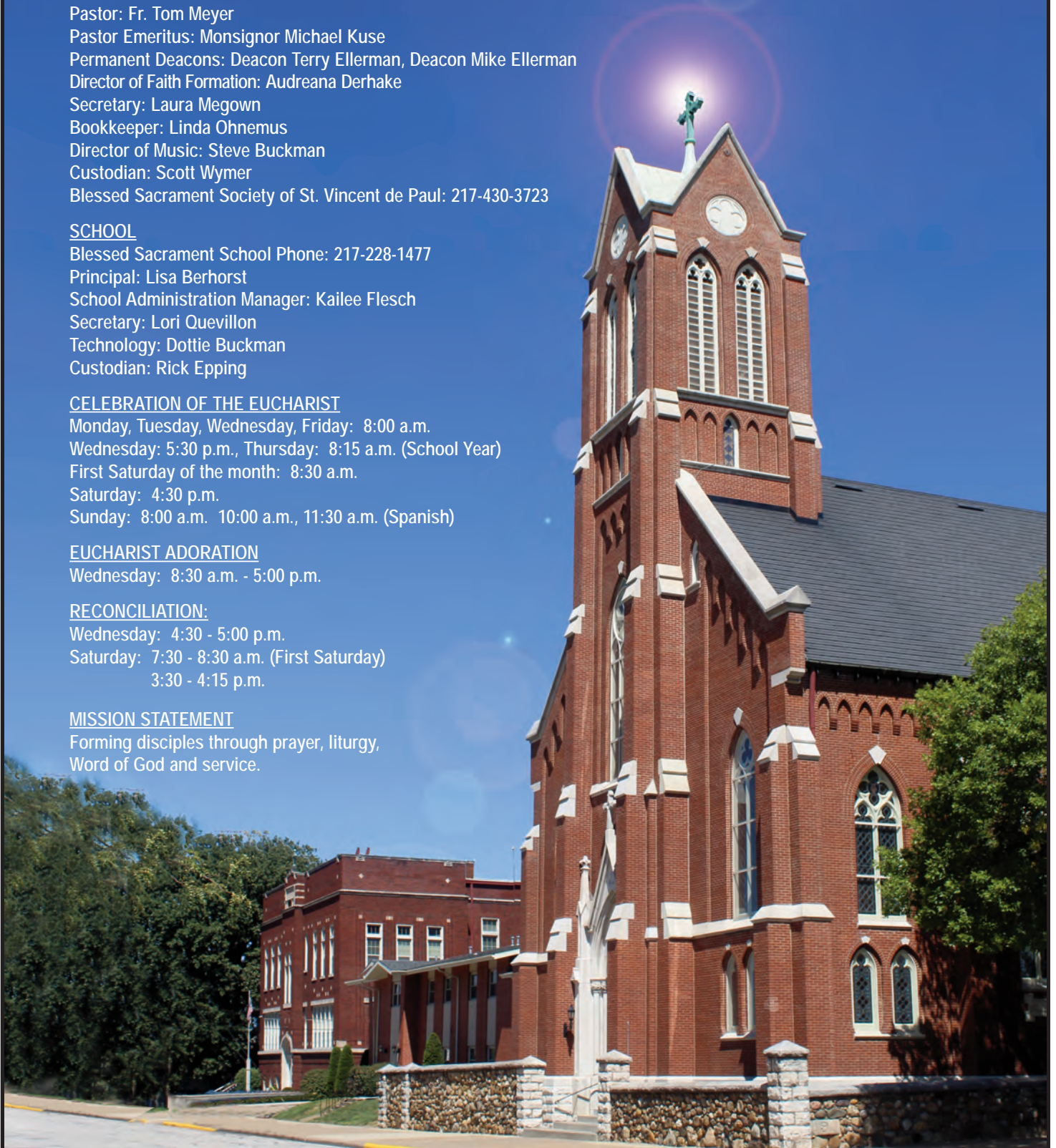

From the Pastor's Desk

Today we celebrate the **6th Sunday of Ordinary Time**. In the first reading from the Book of Sirach, our Lord offers us a choice. "Before man are life and death, good and evil, whichever he chooses shall be given him." When we sin, we are making a choice that takes us away from "Life". Sin attempts to give an illusion of something better that I am missing. Yet when I follow God's commandments, Jesus gives to me all that I will ever need.

This upcoming Wednesday marks the beginning of the season of Lent as we celebrate **Ash Wednesday**. Our Ash Wednesday liturgies will be celebrated at the following three times:

8:15 a.m. Mass
4:00 p.m. Spanish Mass
5:30 p.m. Mass

The season of **Lent** should include the following elements for us to focus upon: (1) Fasting -giving up something we like; (2) Prayer; and (3) Charity – doing charitable works for others and donating money to charity. Blessed Sacrament will provide several liturgical and devotional opportunities each week during Lent to assist you in your spiritual growth during this Lenten season.

Sundays:	9:00-10:00 a.m.: Eucharistic Adoration 9:00-9:30 a.m.: Confessions 9:30 a.m.: Morning Prayer w/ Benediction
Wednesdays:	4:30-5:00 p.m.: Confessions 5:00 p.m.: Vespers w/ Benediction 5:30 p.m.: Mass
Fridays:	5:15 p.m.: Gospel of Matthew Passion Meditation (w/ Meal) 6:15 p.m.: Stations of the Cross (Church)

- The following are the **Lenten regulations** for Catholics to observe.
- (1) Abstinence – Everyone 14 years of age and over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.
 - (2) Fast – Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 is required to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Only one full meatless meal, and two much smaller meatless meals, are permitted. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids are allowed.
 - (3) To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful.

On Fridays at 5:15-6:15 p.m. in the upcoming Season of Lent, I will be presenting a **6-part weekly Lenten Meditations on the "Passion according to St. Matthew."** Each weekly meditation is only 30 minutes long, with a free delicious meatless meal to precede it. I hope it might be a nice way to prepare for the Passion Reading that we will hear this upcoming Palm Sunday. Our Friday evening Lenten schedule will therefore look like this:

- 5:15-5:35 p.m. Lenten Meal provided by the parish (GS)
- 5:40-6:10 p.m. Lenten Meditation on Passion according to St. Matthew
- 6:15-6:45 p.m. Stations of the Cross

During the Season of Lent (February 18 – April 4), **40 Days for Life** will be inviting parish members to sign up for a one-hour time slot to pray in front of our local Walgreen's in order to witness the sanctity of all human life. Please consider signing up for a time slot on **Wednesday's from 9 a.m.-5 p.m.** throughout these 40 days.

Finally, as a way during Lent to offer more opportunities for Prayer and Eucharistic Adoration, **Blessed Sacrament will offer a Weekly Holy Hour on Sunday mornings from 9:00-10:00 a.m. to include the following:**

- 9:00 – 9:30 a.m. Eucharistic Adoration
w/ Confession Available
- 9:30 – 9:45 a.m. (Sung) Morning Prayer
- 9:45 a.m. Benediction

We will begin these five weekly Holy Hours on Sunday February 22. Please consider using this quiet time for your own prayer and meditation during this upcoming season of Lent.

CATECHETICAL CORNER

Welcome to the Catechetical Corner! Each week, we explore a truth of our Catholic faith – a small seed of understanding meant to help our love for Christ and His Church grow.

Why does Lent last 40 days?

Lent lasts **40 days** because the number 40 appears throughout Scripture as a time of preparation, testing, and renewal. Jesus fasted and prayed in the desert for 40 days before beginning His public ministry (Matthew 4:1-2). The Israelites wandered in the desert for 40 years, and Moses and Elijah each spent 40 days in prayer before important moments in salvation history. By observing 40 days of Lent, the Church joins Jesus in the desert, preparing our hearts for the joy of Easter.

These 40 days are meant to be a time of **prayer, fasting, and almsgiving**—not as punishment, but as a way to grow closer to God and turn away from sin. The Catechism explains that the Church unites herself each year to the mystery of Jesus in the desert (cf. CCC 540). Through this season, we learn to rely more fully on God and make room for His grace.

Sundays are always celebrations of the Resurrection and are not counted among the 40 fasting days, which is why Lent stretches across a longer span on the calendar. Even so, the spirit of Lent continues throughout the whole season as we prepare to renew our baptismal promises at Easter.

Prayer:

Lord, walk with us through these 40 days of Lent and lead us to the joy of Easter. Amen.

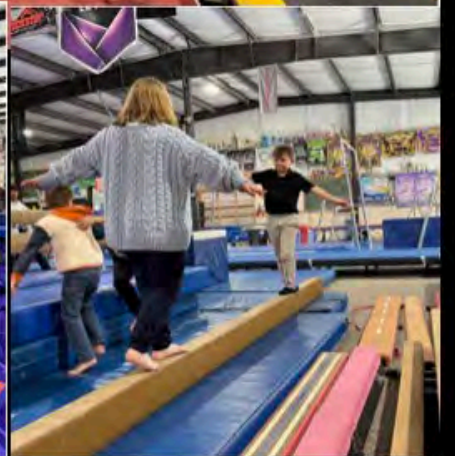

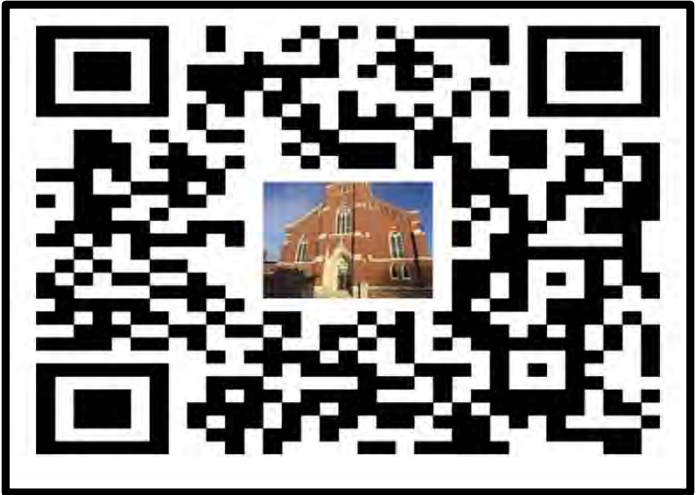
